Liberty Theatre

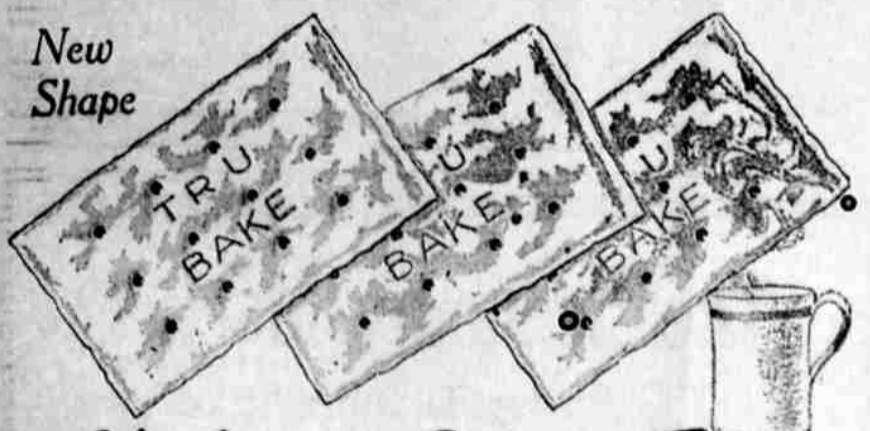
