COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION COMPLETES WORK

The county board of equalization, which met on September 14, has completed its investigation of the various complaints submitted to it and passed on each case. Two protests were allowed and reductions made in assessments. In the case of the assessment of T. B. Virden's property in Kinney's Addition to Roseburg, it was found that the improvements had been assessed \$500 too high and were ordered reduced that amount on the tax roll. A reduction of \$200 in the assessment on improvements on lots belonging to A. G. Gaynor located in Brown's Fair Acres was also ordered. All other assessments were found to be just, conforming to assessment of like property in the same locality, and consequently no changes were made.

This game is expected to be a close and fast one, as the Roseburg boys have been making some good improvements this year. The weaknesses developed at the Marshfield game are being worked on and the team is showing considerable improvement. Several of the boys are still suffering from minor injuries, but the team is in good shape for the coming battle. The team is working out every night practicing tackling and blocking, together with light scrimmages, which is confined chiefly to work with the linemen.

UMPQUA MILLS BUY LARGE AMOUNT OF TIMBER NEAR COAST

REEDSPORT, Ore., Oct. 7.—Further announcement of the acquisition by the Umpqua Mills & Timber company of 450,000,000 feet of standing timber on Smith river, adjacent to Noels creek, eight miles from Reedport, was made here yesterday by L. R. Welles of Minneapolis, Minn., vice-president of the company.

According to Welles, the Umpqua Mills & Timber company, a Washington corporation with a capital of \$24,000,000, was reorganized in August, 1924, as an Oregon corporation with \$1,700,000 capital. In addition to the old shareholders the new organization includes J. O. Errod of Portland, Ore., president, and L. R. Welles of Minneapolis.

The new shareholders owned 700,000,000 feet of timber on Smith river and these holdings have been taken over by the reorganized company, making the total holdings approximately 1,100,000,000 feet. The company has discontinued logging operations in the Snelaw national forest on Murphy creek and has moved the camp and equipment to Noels creek.

Norco Cowdog, formerly with the Silverton Lumber company at Silverton, Ore., is in charge of logging operations. Construction of 2 1/2 miles of logging railroad is under way to the new camp site, where it is expected to commence operating two miles about December 1.

J. B. Kelly of Portland, formerly with the Yacolt Lumber company, Yacolt, Wash., will be the mill superintendent. The mill now is cutting material for the logging railway. This work will be finished in about two weeks. The mill will then be closed until the new camp can be finished. Spur track construction will start as soon as the grade is completed. Ties for the track have been cut.

After the shutdown changes and improvements at the mill will be made which will increase the daily cutting capacity from 75,000 to 100,000 feet. It is planned to operate the enlarged mill continuously.

J. G. Sturup, secretary and treasurer of the company, has moved to Portland and opened a lumber office for the company in the Gordon building on Stark street.

Prof. Hobbs is here assisting in the scientific program for the expedition of Laugel Koch across the inland ice of Greenland next year.

A similar phenomenon is only to be found on the Antarctic continent, where Sir Douglas Mawson, by wireless from the inland ice, warned the south coast of Australia of a terrible cyclone that reached Australia 48 hours later, said Prof. Hobbs.

Most of the weather affecting Europe comes from Greenland's icy mountains, Prof. Hobbs believes.

The results of the long series of expeditions on the inland ice, which were commenced by Dalager some 150 years ago, clearly shows that the storms of northern and western Europe originate as cyclones in the cold air of the interior of Greenland and from there rage over and beyond the coast with a violence which surpasses that of a tropical hurricane," he said.

"In the interior of Greenland it is, according to my theory, practically calm. The clouds there descend on the mountain tops, which is the cause of the thick fog with frost rim, which is always mentioned in reports from there. From the interior the winds are then blown to all sides out beyond the coast."

The new Koch expedition across Greenland will have an opportunity of testing Prof. Hobbs' theories. Koch will carry self-registering apparatus for measuring meteorological conditions and newly invented appliances, able to stand the shaking of sledge travels.

SYNDICATE TAKES OVER BIG ACREAGE OF MILLER AND LUX

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 8.—The extensive holdings of Miller and Lux, Inc., comprising approximately 300,000 acres of California land, are to be divided and placed under cultivation, a syndicate of bankers announced here.

Cultivation and development of the properties, estimated to be worth \$50,000,000, will be brought about through the issuance of \$25,000,000 in bonds during the first part of next week by the syndicate headed by Pierce, Fenner and company, and Blythe, Witter and company.

The Miller and Lux company also own 200,000 acres of uncultivated land in Oregon and Nevada, which is to be included in the development plan.

Practically all of the properties have remained idle since their acquisition by the late Henry Miller, cattle and land baron, from Spanish land grants during the early days of California.
