**NEW HOTEL TO  
BE OPENED IN  
A SHORT TIME**

Rose Investment Company's  
**Fireproof Structure Now  
Being Completed.**

**FURNITURE IS HERE**

Fourth and Fifth Floors  
Now Ready—Dining  
Room to Open in  
Few Days.

The final touches are being given the Rose Investment company hotel at the corner of Sheridan and Lane streets, preparatory to the formal opening, which is expected to occur about the first of the month. The fourth and fifth floors are now completely furnished and are being occupied, while the furniture is all on hand for the other floors and will be installed as rapidly as possible.

The building is the only completely fireproof hotel structure in southern Oregon, the only combustible material entering into its construction being the window and door frames. The floors and walls are all of poured concrete. The partitions are of hollow gypsum plaster blocks, while the plaster is placed over steel lath.

The building is five stories in height and has a full basement. The ground floor accommodates the lobby, two store buildings, kitchen and dining room, while the four upper floors each have fifteen sleeping rooms.

Each guest room has either private or communicating bath, while each has an individual wash room. The hollow plaster partitions and the heavy concrete floors, the latter padded with carpet, make the building practically soundproof.

The rooms are beautifully furnished, the bedroom sets being of walnut, each decorated with stenciled rose designs. The rose feature is carried out in the curtains also.

An automatic lift provides rapid elevator service for the guests. The elevator is of the latest automatic type, safe and foolproof. It not only gives prompt service but does away with the necessity of maintaining an elevator boy.

On the lower floor there are two store buildings, one at the corner of Stephens and Lane streets and the other on Lane street. The corner store has not yet been leased, but the other will be occupied by a barber shop operated by J. E. F. ril.

The management has secured O. W. Neelands and Mrs. Sadie Risley to operate the kitchen and dining room. Mr. Neelands was former chef at the Roosevelt hotel in Portland, and has been employed in some of the leading restaurants and hotels of the coast, having a wide reputation for his ability in the culinary line. Mrs. Risley is experienced in the operation of a dining room and will have full charge of that department. The dining room will be open in a few days.

The hotel will be under the management of George E. Smith, president of the Rose Investment company, which has constructed the building. The company is composed of Mr. Smith, Milton Keyser, vice president and L. W. Metzger, secretary and treasurer.

Although the fourth and fifth floors are already being used for the accommodation of guests, the formal opening will not take place for a short time, but will probably occur about the first of the month.

**GRANTS PASS MAN  
WINS IRRIGATION  
JOB BY CLOSE VOTE**

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)  
GRANTS PASS, Ore., Oct. 8.—Wilford Allen, of Grants Pass, was elected president of the Oregon Irrigation congress at the concluding session of the annual meeting here last night. He defeated James M. Kyle, of Stanfield, who has been president for two years. The vote was Allen 157, Kyle 153. W. T. Power, of Oregon Agricultural College, was

lected secretary, succeeding Walter E. Meacham.  
A resolution was adopted urging the state securities commission to require every district whose interest on bonds has been guaranteed by the state to employ a colonization agent. Rhea Luper, state engineer, declared that only 3600 families would be required to complete settlement of every district.

Concerning the proposal of Secretary of the Interior Work that the state should co-operate financially in developing reclamation projects, the congress adopted a resolution, saying the state had no power under the constitution or otherwise to co-operate financially in aiding settlers on federal reclamation undertakings.

Approval was given the proposal of Dr. Work that repayment must be made to the reclamation

fund of the annual charges due from existing projects.  
Other resolutions called for the appointment of a committee to make a complete survey of the irrigation in Oregon, to report back at the next annual conference; resolutions indorsing the making of Crescent City a harbor of refuge and shipping port, and a resolution approving the Oregon state development fund.
