



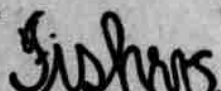

EUGENE RESENTS TODD'S BRINGING IN DOVERY CASE

(Associated Press Local Wire.) EUGENE, Ore., Oct. 15.—Emphatic disapproval of A. Kuric Todd, deposed mayor of Kelso, Wash., and his proposed mass meeting at the Eugene armory tonight has been voiced by Mayor E. B. Parks of this city.

"I am against anything of this kind," Mayor Parks said. "I cannot say that an address by Todd on the subject of the Dovery murder will be of any benefit to the citizens of Eugene. What he expects to gain by coming here is beyond my comprehension. It is Kelso's fight, and it should stay there."

Todd, when questioned directly as to his purpose here, said: "This is Dovery's home town and I want to awaken public sentiment to the true situation. The newspaper stories have been colored by correspondents and were not true accounts."

Todd is contradicting the holdup theory in the Dovery murder case, and declares that Luke S. May, Seattle criminologist, is bungling the case.

Todd stated yesterday that efforts would be made to get Clarence Darrow or some other lawyer of equal prominence to handle the case as soon as his investigations were completed.

KELSO, Wash., Oct. 15.—Sheriff Clark Studebaker said today that Miss Vilda Russell, who was brought here from Portland, as a witness in the Dovery murder case, "knows considerable about the actions of the persons accused of the murder." Further than that the sheriff would make no statement. Miss Russell had never been in Kelso previous to a time she was brought here as a witness, so far as officials know.

NEW EPISCOPAL CHURCH HEAD IS GARDNER MURRAY
(Associated Press Local Wire.) NEW ORLEANS, La., Oct. 15.—The forty-eighth triennial convention of the Episcopal church in the United States resumed its sessions here today after having completed yesterday the most important business before it—the election of its first primate. The new primate, who now is the Most Rev. Gardner Murray, succeeds the present presiding bishop, The Most Rev. Ethelbert Talbot, Bishop of Bethlehem, and will direct the executive and administrative decision of the church as well as occupying the office of primate, which takes the place of the presiding bishop. Bishop Murray was elected on the fifteenth ballot after almost a full day of balloting by the House of Bishops, on a list of eight nominees, which were selected Tuesday.
