WEINGARTNER'S APPOINTMENT CAPS LONG OPERATIC CAREER

BERLIN, Oct. 16.—(A. P.)—Felix von Weingartner, the famous musician, and the equally famous French philosopher, Henri Bergson, have been elected chairmen of the newly founded League of Nations commission for intellectual collaboration.

Weingartner was born in Dalmatia in 1863 and called to the Berlin Royal Opera as alternating chief conductor. In 1891, in 1898 he went to Munich to conduct a series of guest performances and subsequently also in Vienna, without the permission of Count von Huelssen, at that time the intendant of the Berlin opera. Thereupon Count von Huelssen charged von Weingartner with having broken his contract. The court finally ruled that von Weingartner was to be prohibited from conducting in Berlin for the term of 16 years.

In 1902, however, he severed this Gordian knot by giving a series of symphonic concerts in Puersternwalde, a suburb just beyond the precincts of Berlin. The event at that time was the talk of all Germany. Weingartner was married to the American singer, Lucille Mareel, who died in 1921.
