### GIRL'S PRACTICAL MIND CAUSED THE DALLES TRAGEDY

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) THE DALLES, Ore., Oct. 17.—Two funerals, one, that of the girl, this afternoon, the other that of the youth tomorrow, are to be held instead of a wedding, as the result of the tragic ending of the romance of Harold Stedman and Cressa Crane. The coroner's inquest last night developed that the pair, who were found shot to death on a road four miles south of The Dalles yesterday, had planned to be married. The girl had not changed her mind, but would not marry until Stedman had saved some money and provided some furniture for a home. The jury's verdict was that the girl came to her death from gunshot wound inflicted by Stedman, and that he had died from a self-inflicted wound. The youth was also known by the name of Steel.

It was brought out at the inquest that the note in the girl's purse, regarding notification of her father in case of accident, was not put there by her through fear of Stedman, but was written by her father. She had driven Stedman car a number of times, and was an inexperienced driver, and her father feared she might meet with an accident.

### ROUGH SURVEY OF PROPOSED SMITH RIVER ROAD MADE

County Engineer Floyd Frear and County Surveyor H. L. Eppstein returned last night from Smith River, where they have been tentatively locating the route for the proposed road up the stream. The residents of the Smith River community propose to form a large district, including the entire watershed, and to build a small section of road each year until the entire 25-mile stretch is completed. Several tentative locations have been suggested and a written report of the findings will be placed before the court. Roughly estimated the cost of this proposed road will be around \$250,000, the county engineer says. This, of course is only a rough estimate as no actual survey has been run. Clearing, grading and culverts, he estimates, will amount to \$150,000, gravel \$62,500 and bridges \$44,000.

### FIRE AT THE NERBAS HOME.

Fire starting from a fire passing through a wooden partition caused considerable damage at the home of Dr. H. K. Nerbas shortly after noon today. The fire, where it entered the chimney, passed to near the wood in the partition, causing the boards to smolder. The fire burned up between the partition and the outer wall and had a good start before it was discovered. Owing to the location of the blaze it was hard to fight and the fire department had considerable difficulty before getting it entirely out. The damage is covered by insurance.

### AMERICAN EMPLOYMENT CONDITIONS IMPROVED

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—A continued increase in employment during the month of September was reported today by the bureau of labor statistics of the department of labor as indicating a "well defined upward trend" in employment that marks a favorable outlook for the country's manufacturing industries. Each of the twelve groups of industries as segregated by the bureau shared in the gain, with a general increase of 1.5 per cent in September as compared with August, although the aggregate earning of employees fell off slightly due to Labor day.

Compared with the same month last year, the volume of employment in September showed an increase of 7.7 per cent.
