

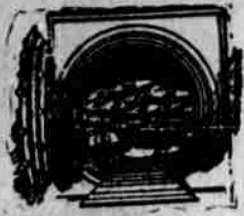

STATE EXPENSE LIGHTER THAN FOR LAST YEAR

Statistics Show Decrease in General Departments—Bond Indebtedness Creates Burden.

WASHINGTON, D. C., October 19, 1925. — The Department of Commerce announces a summary of the financial statistics of the State of Oregon for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1924.

The payments for maintenance and operation of the general department of Oregon for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1924, amounted to \$9,198,381, or \$11.06 per capita. This includes \$430,496, apportionments for education to the minor civil divisions of the state. In 1923 the comparative per capita for maintenance and operation of general departments was \$12.04, and in 1917, \$5.90. The expenses of public service enterprises amounted to \$11,936; interest on debt, \$2,675,800; and outlays for permanent improvements, \$7,631,530. The total payments, therefore, for expenses of general departments and public service enterprises, interest, and outlays were \$19,517,707. The totals include all payments for the year, whether made from current revenues or from the proceeds of bond issues.

Of the governmental costs reported above, \$3,472,104 was for highways, \$1,536,640 being for maintenance and \$6,935,464 for construction.

Property Tax Lower. The total revenue receipts of Oregon for 1924 were \$20,211,152, or \$24.30 per capita. This was \$3,225,035 more than the total payments of the year, exclusive of the payments for permanent improvements, and \$693,445 less than the total payments including those for permanent improvements. Property and special taxes represented 35.4 per cent of the total revenue for 1924, 45.3 per cent for 1923, and 64.1 per cent for 1917. The increase
