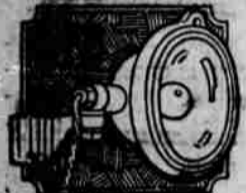

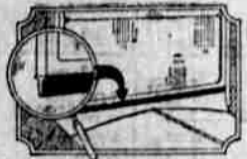

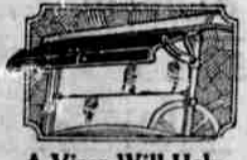

ANOTHER PERFECT PLANE GOES WRONG AFTER A HOP-OFF

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) BAYSHORE PARK, Baltimore, Oct. 23.—Great Britain's "mystery plane," the super marine Napier S-4, crashed this morning during the navigability trials and is a total wreck. Captain Henry C. Beard, the pilot, is suffering from immersion and shock but escaped serious injury.

Captain Beard had just taken off for the navigability and seaworthiness trials and was at an elevation of about two hundred feet when a wing flutter apparently developed in both wings of the monoplane. Captain Beard attempted at once to land. As he struck the water, the super-marine nosed down and somersaulted on her back, pressing the pilot under the surface.

Captain Beard was wearing a lifebelt and managed to clear himself and reached the surface as the Napier S-4 sunk. Captain Hubert Broad, who had taken the British Gloster Napier III out for her tests a short time before, seeing Captain Beard in trouble started taxiing toward him as he fell. When Captain Beard freed himself from the wreckage Captain Broad threw him a second lifebelt to which he clung until rescue boats picked him up a few minutes later.

The crash occurred about a half mile off shore from the hangars. The super marine's mishap will throw into the Schneider cup race tomorrow both of Great Britain's Gloster-Napier IIIs, one of which had been held in reserve. Bert Hinkler of Melbourne, Australia, the British reserve pilot, will take the second Gloster into the race tomorrow. Captain Beard intended to make no attempt to take part in the cup race after the shattering of his super marine.

The super marine disintegrated as she sank in the water. Salvage boats on the scene a few minutes after the crash succeeded in bringing to the surface the super marine Napier-Lion engine. The rest of the plane appeared to be practically a total loss.

Captain Beard said that when he crashed the engine appeared to be functioning perfectly.

CURIOUS ORIGIN OF BUILDING RECALLED BY ALTERATIONS.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 22.—A brokerage firm is making interior alterations in the Parrott Building, a structure built in 1852 of stones brought from China.

When the ship sailed in from Hongkong and landed at the stone wharf, the city then had, Chinese coolies secured the great stones to bamboo poles and carried them to the site. There was no derrick, and the stones were lifted into place by a primitive system of poles and ropes. But the coolies, directed by an American contractor, did a good job.

The little three-story building stood staunchly through the 72 years of progress. It was one of the few downtown to survive the earthquake and fire of 1906. It presents a strange contrast to the glossy surface of the giant structures of San Francisco's "Wall Street." Although interior improvements are being made, the exterior, built to endure, will not be changed.
