PORTLAND, Orc., Oct. 30.—Substitution of historical pageants for round-ups and rodeos was recommended by the Oregon congress of parents and teachers when in its concluding grist of resolutions, it adopted one disapproving the "wild western" type of entertainment.

"We do hereby express our disapproval of these performances, and we protest to those cities and towns in our state which sponsor them against any recurrence," said the resolution, which was introduced by the secretary, Mrs. Lillie B. Thomas.

"We further desire to express to their managers our belief that these occasions could be made much more interesting and aitractive through the elaboration of pageantry features, which would give in wonderful colorful detail the picturesque development of the Oregon country from its earliest ploneer days."
