PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 2.—Whether the engineer of the train which killed her parents near Harborside, Ore., August 13, in an automobile collision shall be allowed to adopt nine-year-old Evelyn Castle, was the question before Circuit Judge Evans at a hearing today.

Following the accident for which the engineer, Harvey Carpenter, was held in no way to blame, the girl was turned over by a court order to the care of the boys and girls aid society.

Carpenter, in grief over the accident, asked that he be permitted to adopt the girl.
