U. S. CRIME WAVES.

By comparing the number of persons murdered in the United States during the past forty years, with the number killed in battle or died of wounds, S. S. McClure in an article in the November McClure's Magazine records what he calls "Forty Years of Lawlessness in the United States."

"During the last forty years, the number of persons murdered in the United States, equals the number of soldiers killed or who died of wounds on all the battlefields of all the wars fought by the United States from the War of the Revolution to the Spanish-American War, including both Federal and Confederate losses in the Civil War."

The writer adds that this record of murder such as is known in no civilized country, is the clearest indication of the essential weakness of our national, state and city governments.

PREMIER KING NOT TO QUIT DESPITE PARTY MINORITY

(Associated Press Special Wire.) OTTAWA Ont., Nov. 5.—It is the purpose of W. McKenna King, the premier, to go before parliament with his cabinet, notwithstanding the fact that the liberals, of which party he is the leader, are in the minority of the House of Commons in consequence of the recent general election.

This announcement was made last night by Mr. King in a lengthy statement, in which he took the ground that although the conservatives led by Arthur Meighen, had 114 seats in the chamber, as against 102 for the liberals, this was far from indicating that Mr. Meighen was in a position to command a majority of the 214 members. In fact, Mr. King added, the results of the elections, "appear clearly to indicate that he is not in such a position."

The statement was issued after several conferences with the government-general.

GREATER AID TO AIR CRAFT HELD FEDERAL DUTY

of the government departments concerned. "That present restrictions requiring competitive bidding for government purchase of aircraft be modified to permit equitable compensation to the manufacturer for design and development of aircraft."

"The government, while carrying on 'fundamental research' in aviation, should not compete in the design of construction of civil aircraft, nor handicap civil development by discrimination in aeronautical matters."

"That the government adopt a policy of facilitating the exportation of commercial aircraft, instead of opposing this as in the past for fear of their use for military purposes."

To Restore Confidence. It was believed that such a policy adopted in the industry would gradually work to remove the present "lack of public and business confidence and support" and prepare the way for the assistance the committee bespeaks for it from this quarter."

The report recommends that aircraft underwriters and life and accident insurance companies grant more favorably rates for the enterprise of commercial flying. Financial interests were addressed to invest in commercial air routes only with full knowledge of the costs involved and the responsibility of the operators.

State governments generally were urged to follow the example of several which already authorized by legislation the acquisition by municipalities of landing fields or facilities for commercial aviation. In the matter of state regulation for civil aviation, the committee declared the lack of uniformity in the several state laws already enacted only worked to its disadvantage in the absence of a federal control law.

LEMON RECEIPTS

I know of no mild bleach better than lemon juice, for the complexion, for the hands and for any number of household purposes.

Use it full strength as a nail bleach. I keep it in a tiny bottle in the bathroom with a blunt nose orangewood stick nearby. Whenever my nails are stained I rub a little around and under the edges, I then wash it off with warm water as the juice is drying.

This same mixture is very good for bleaching the neck and arms, particularly when they are freckled. The skin being less sensitive the mixture can be stronger, that is, less water and more lemon.

Efficient Housekeeping. CAN YOU MAKE GOOD DOUGHNUTS? two tablespoons of melted butter. The dough will be quite stiff. Take out a little of it at a time, toss it on a slightly-floured bread board and knead slightly before rolling to one-third inch in thickness and cutting into rings with a doughnut cutter.

Again and again my Bride Readers write me that they cannot make light baking-powder doughnuts. Many of them have success with raised doughnuts, but fail on the "quick" variety.

When I start to make doughnuts, I first sift three cups of ordinary bread flour, with four teaspoons of baking powder, one teaspoon of ground cinnamon, and one tablespoon of salt.

Tomorrow's Menu. Breakfast: Stewed Dried Apricots, Cereal, Toast. Poached Eggs, Coffee. Luncheon: Baked Macaroni and Cheese, Lettuce, Wholewheat Bread. Dinner: Clear Soup, Brown Gravy, Mashed Potatoes, Celery, Mince Pie, Coffee.

Generally a doughnut will be done on one side in from one to two minutes. Often it will turn its side is lighter than the uncooked upper side. If not, turn it over with a long-handled fork.
