This Generation May See Return to Knee Breeches

Madagascar Once Home of Enormous Reptiles

It is a singular fact that, barring the wild cattle and the crocodiles, the great African island (Madagascar) is wholly destitute of big game. Yet it teems with animal life in its lesser forms, including such curious animals as the aye-aye, one of the most remarkable creatures known; 29 varieties of lemurs; a ferocious member of the civet family, which looks like an enormous weasel; and a wild dog which appears to be a cross between a coyote, a jackal and a dingo.

But Madagascar has not always lacked large animals, as its fossil remains attest. For in ages past it was the habitat of enormous terrestrial lizards 50 feet in length, and of the great wingless bird the meganychia, twice the size of an ostrich.

Hardy Redwood

Nature has endowed the giant redwoods with a natural preservative which protects the timber against decay and rot indefinitely for centuries, in fact after the trees have fallen or been cut down. Trees known to have been blown over in the woods long before the discovery of America, and which have lain exposed to the elements ever since, have been found to be in splendid condition and capable of use as commercial timber.

One particular instance is recorded where a fallen tree was found that had grown astraddle the uprooted giant, but when the standing tree was cut its rings showed it to be nearly 1,000 years old. This meant that the uprooted tree had been down for nearly 1,000 years. The rings of the fallen tree showed it to be about 600 years old when it fell, yet the log was sound and healthy. —Kredit News.

Buddhist Priests Trained for Japanese Suffrage Campaign

OSAKA, Japan, Nov. 5.—Three thousand Buddhist priests are being trained to take up the campaign in behalf of universal suffrage. Universal suffrage will be tried out in Japan for the first time at the next election, which may come next year.

In the training schools lectures are given every day by scholars and high officials in government departments. When the course is completed the priests will instruct hundreds of other priests and then the nation-wide campaign will start.

Southern Baptist Baptism Set a New Evangelistic Mark

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Nov. 5.—With the administering of 1,037,550 baptisms by the Southern Baptist church during the last five years, a new evangelistic record for all evangelical denominations has been established, said Dr. E. P. Allredge, statistical secretary. Dr. Allredge said that this is an average of 207,510 baptisms annually for the five years of 1920-24, inclusive, and 48 baptisms for every daylight hour.

May Turn Sawdust and Waste into Non-Inflammable Board

TACOMA, Wash., Nov. 5.—A synthetic board, non-inflammable and resisting heat and cold, may soon be manufactured from sawdust. A group of lumber men here became interested in the possibilities of the product after a demonstration proved that the synthetic board would withstand a flame that would cut through steel. Sawdust and other mill waste are treated with chemicals and made into pulp. The pulp then is pressed into boards of any size.

13 Horses and Four False Starts Kill the Starter

MARSEILLES, Nov. 5.—Thirteen horses and four false starts in the same race killed Marcel Binou, for more than 20 years official starter at the Marseilles racetrack. SYRIA ABLAZE WITH THE FIRES OF REBELLION

with tribesmen who had torn up the railway line running through Hodejaz.

Druse leaders in Damascus are quoted by a correspondent as de-

claring that the French had given no consideration to the people and that the situation had reached such a stage that they consider it better to fall fighting than to live under such conditions.

"Our villages," said one of the leaders, "have been burned and our men killed. But the French will never kill the soul of our people."

PARIS, Nov. 5.—The Cairo correspondent of La Liberte says a bandit chieftain named Bekri has been proclaimed "president of the Syrian Republic" with headquarters at Homs, and that he has concentrated forces estimated at 4,000 men, 15 miles south of Damascus.

New French forces have arrived at Damascus, according to the correspondent, and the city has been placed in a state of defense, with machine gun posts established in the suburbs.

A column under Colonel Gamelin left the city yesterday to clear the district of rebels.

U. S. Warships Arrive.

BEIRUT, Syria, Nov. 5.—The American destroyers Conhain and Lamson, sent from Alexandria yesterday, in view of the possibility of danger to American lives

and property in Syria, arrived here today.
