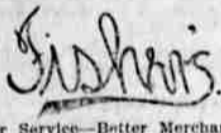

DOCTOR ON TRIAL FOR KILLING HIS IMBECILE CHILD

(Associated Press Licensed Wire.)
LITTLETON, Colo., Nov. 6.—A jury to try Dr. Harold Elmer Blazer on a charge of murdering his 34-year-old daughter, Hazel, the "child woman," was obtained in district court here shortly after noon today.

Joel Stone, prosecuting attorney, who is pushing the murder charge against Dr. Blazer, aged physician, has the utmost confidence in the sincerity of the farmers and tradesmen who have been selected as jurors to try the case.

"It is well that the trial in this case has been delayed until the atmosphere has had time to clear until there has been time for the heat of passion and prejudice to subside somewhat," he said today. "Three months ago Dr. Blazer would have been acquitted on the first ballot, so great were the waves of popular sympathy that swept over the community when the major points in the taking of human life became known. Now it is different."

Lewis D. E. R. Mowery, chief of defense counsel, however, feels that the case which he termed "heart versus head" must result inevitably in a victory for the latter.

"Our contention that the 'thing' Dr. Blazer did was better off dead than alive will find a responsive chord in the minds of the jury," he declared today. "Even if jurors do not heed our plea of temporary insanity and the testimony of our alienists, they must agree that this 'human hunk' had no place in the scheme of life; that it had no soul and that Dr. Blazer was fully justified in taking this so-called 'human life'."

The jury that will try Blazer consists of four farmers, two carpenters, one lumber dealer, a garage owner, an auditor, a former pool hall owner, druggist and a banker.

All but two are married and six of the men are fathers.
