SOUTH DAKOTANS BUY WILBER FARMS

Two men who recently arrived in Douglas county with their families from South Dakota have become permanent residents of the Wilbur locality through the purchase of farms. One is Paul Abeel, who became the owner of the former W. R. Kinzel tract of 10 acres adjoining the Wilbur academy grounds, and the other is A. J. Crocker, who bought the old W. B. Lamb place of 115 acres, a half mile north of Wilbur, from J. G. Sands. Both buyers are in possession. Mr. Kinzel will continue his residence at Wilbur indefinitely. He is at present engaged in erecting a new store building for E. F. McKay, to replace the one recently destroyed by fire. Mr. Sands' plans for the future are not announced. The new residents, Messrs. BEAUTY CHATS

THE MANICURE

Start off like this:— Fill a bowl with warm water, rub enough soap in it to make it slightly cloudy, and add a few drops of lemon juice, or a small bit of lemon. Lay out on your dressing table a long flexible steel file, an orange wood stick, a pointed file or a cuticle knife, cuticle scissors, a little cold cream or vaseline, an emery board and a bottle of lemon juice or some other good nail brush. Roll a wisp of cotton around the orange wood stick.

Do the next hand the same way. Then rub on rouge, pomade, or whatever you like to tint the nails, wipe off, and polish. Use polishing powder; if you like it, buy this. It is cheaper to get it ready made than to make it yourself. Again wash the nails, this time to remove powder and cream, and polish again; this is the final polish. Your nails should be pink, glossy, free of stains, smooth all around, with a creamy white appearance; at the tips and a distinct white "moon" at the top.

Mrs. G. H. F.: As your hair line is a becoming one you should make the most of it and wear your hair combed away from your forehead. There are so few women who can do this that it is a very distinctive way of dressing the hair.

Mrs. F. D. J.: Bleach the hair on your face with peroxide or try to have it removed by electrolysis, do not experiment with depilatories; they merely rot off the surface hair and the new hair grows out much coarser. If there are any conspicuous hairs after the bleaching you can extract them by using a blunt end tweezers.

Use the emery board to give a smooth finish. The steel file never wears the nail off clean so the emery board must always finish the job. Rub on cream, vaseline, and again push back the skin, this time with the blunt end of the orange stick.

STILL POSSESSOR GETS 6 MONTHS IN JAIL, \$500 FINE. Another violator of the prohibition law was received in Roseburg yesterday from Reedsport to serve time in the county jail. He is Chester Ray, sentenced to six months imprisonment following his plea of guilty before Justice of the Peace Benson at Reedsport to the charge of possessing a still. The penalty also included a fine of \$500. This has not been paid by Ray, but the officers are of the opinion that he will be able to raise that amount before the expiration of his term in jail. The liquor still involved in the case was found by officers at the home of Harry Davis, at the old Assen logging camp, near Winstonchester Bay, according to the report at the sheriff's office. Davis faces the same charge as that to which Ray admitted guilt, but his arrest has been deferred until he recovers from a surgical operation which he underwent a few days ago in a hospital at North Bend, where he is now reported as convalescent.
