

ROSEBURG LOSES 6 TO 0 GAME TO GRANTS PASS HIGH

Although defeated 6 to 0 by Grants Pass high school yesterday, the Roseburg high school football team made the best showing this season. For three, and almost four, quarters the local team carried the game into Grants Pass territory, forcing the fight over the entire distance, only to lose on a fluke play with only six minutes to go.

Roseburg had carried the ball to the Grants Pass 20-yard line, and with 3 yards to go on the third down, tried a pass over the goal line. A desperate Grants Pass back speared the ball in mid-air and raced 90 yards for a touchdown.

The local boys for the first time this year exhibited an offensive. Throughout the game they forced the Grants Pass players to stay on the defensive and the entire game was played outside Roseburg's 35-yard line, and mostly in Grants Pass territory, with the exception of the one lone touchdown. Roseburg made first downs time and again, with the line tearing holes wide enough to drive a horse through. The Roseburg backfield, however, was slow, and the runners were un-

able to dodge the Grants Pass backs, and consequently failed to take advantage of the openings made for them.

The ball surged back and forth, chiefly in Roseburg's possession for the first three quarters. Near the end of the third period Roseburg carried the pigskin to the Grants Pass 3-yard line, and tried to drive it over with line bucks, but was held for down.

The game had the appearance of a nothing tie during the final period, but near the close Roseburg started another drive toward the enemy goal. On the 20-yard line, with two downs to go, it looked like an opportune time for a scoring pass, but the attempt was intercepted, and slipping through the broken field, the Grants Pass runner made the only touchdown of the game with six minutes left to play. The kick for the goal failed, leaving the score 6 to 0.

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., Nov. 12.—Klamath High School defeated Alturas, California, high school at football here yesterday, 47 to 0. The light Alturas team was no match for the locals, who used their second string for nearly half of the game.
