## MACK TRUCKS, CHRYSLER STOCKS DOWN AGAIN.

NEW YORK, Nov. 18.—An avalanche of selling orders engulfed the stock market shortly before noon today, causing prices of high priced motors and specialties to tumble 5 to 10 points from their early high levels. The attack broke down an early attempt of cool operators to bolster up their favorites and was directed with particular violence against volatile motor shares. Chrysler crumbled 15 points within a few minutes and Mack Trucks dropped from 27 1/2 to 21 1/2 despite the declaration of a 50 per cent stock dividend.

## STUDIO FIRE SCATTERS ACTORS AT HOLLYWOOD

## STATE SEEKS NEW HEAD FOR THE DEAF SCHOOL

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 18.—Over a dozen deaf school experts are being considered by the state board of control for the superintendency of the Oregon school for the deaf when the resignation of O. L. McIntyre becomes effective the last of this month. Most of the applications are not voluntary, however, the board having found it necessary to solicit applications and most of them are willing to come to Oregon only on condition that a higher salary be paid. The salary is only \$1500 a year, but residence and living expenses are furnished. Among those willing to come if the salary is increased is E. S. Tillinghast, who for many years was superintendent of the Oregon school. He is now head of the South Dakota school at Sioux Falls.
