GRANGERS DEMAND FULL PAYMENT OF WORLD WAR DEBTS

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) SACRAMENTO, Cal., Nov. 19.—A general summary of the business which will come before the delegates to the National Grange convention before the closing minutes tonight was given out today by officers of the organization. All of the questions to be touched upon are national ones. Briefly outlined the resolutions are as follows: The repeal of the recent raise in parcel post rates; a petition to the government asking that more funds be set aside for protection against European cattle diseases and the corn borer; general resolutions asking for reduction in taxes, particularly income taxes; and a request that the World War debts be paid in full.

After hearing the testimony of the witnesses the jury returned a verdict of not guilty.
