### TURKEY PRICE TODAY 42 CENTS; RECEIPTS LIGHT

The turkey day of the present time is far from comparison with similar days of a few years ago when long lines of wagons and trucks waited at the various buying stations for the unloading of their great pile of birds. Today the receipts have been so light that buyers are preparing in some instances to truck their fowls to Oakland to load them for shipment to market.

The market opened at 41 cents and quickly went to 42 cents, where it remained throughout the day. One pool of 500 birds at Oakland brought 46 cents, while about 300 birds in Roseburg were sold for 42 cents. These were the only departures, so far as known, however, from the 42-cent price. These prices prevailed only while buyers secured enough turkeys to supply orders already contracted and the original price was then restored.

### Turkey Prices Today

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 20.—Receipts of turkeys in the local market were very light today and prices were firm to shade higher. Dealers and commission men expect a heavy run tomorrow and Sunday. Houses will remain open Sunday to take care of shipments coming in.

Heavy buying of retail dealers is expected to reach the peak Sunday or Monday. So far it has been limited. Quality of birds coming in so far has been exceptionally high. Dressed turkeys are quoted today at 41 and 42 cents for first grade; live birds at 32 and 33 cents.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 20.—(U. S. Bureau Agricultural Economics) The turkey market was slightly stronger today with only moderate receipts. With a crop somewhat below normal and with turkeys maturing rather late, conditions point toward a firm market for the Thanksgiving week. Quotations today: Young live 41¢@43¢; old 36¢@40¢; dressed young 48¢@51¢; old 44¢@46¢; culls 35¢@38¢.

great military establishments or to meet municipal expenditures, which should either be eliminated by government economy or supplied by taxation, do not appear to serve a useful purpose and ought to be discouraged.

"Our bankers," he continued, "have a great deal of responsibility in relation to the soundness of these loans, when they undertake to invest the savings of our country abroad. I should regret very much to see our possession of resources which are available to meet needs in other countries be the cause of any sentiment of envy or unkindness toward us."

"Would you join world court. Near the end of his prepared address the President touched on the World Court issue with this statement: "With our already enormous and constantly increasing interests abroad, there are constantly accumulating reasons why we should signify our adherence to the Permanent Court of International Justice. Mindful of our determination to avoid all interference in the political affairs, which do not concern us, of other nations, I can think of no more reassuring action than the declaration of America that it will wholeheartedly join with others in the support of the tribunal for the administration of international justice which they have created."

"We can conceive of nothing that we could do, which involves assuming so few obligations on our part, that would be likely to prove of so much value to the world. Beyond its practical effect, which might be somewhat small, it would have a sentimental effect, which would be tremendous. It would be public notice that the enormous influences of our country were to be cast upon the side of the enlightening processes of civilization. It would be the beginning of a new world spirit."

your organization which can supply a large foreign trade, and the generative buying of feed, thus reducing overhead costs, has made a profitable market, which apparently will bear considerable expansion, the committee reports.

The committee recommends the expansion, in a moderate degree, of the poultry business, following out the lines of cooperative marketing and buying.

The report also goes into detail in its recommendations, indicating the size of the flocks with which beginners should start and the methods to be employed, the report being of great value to all who might be interested in going into the business or adding poultry as a sideline on the farm. The report points out where so many come to failure, and shows just how much capital is necessary in the business and the results which may be expected.
