MALCONTENTS IN IRELAND THROW BOMB AND SHOOT

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
DUBLIN, Nov. 20.—A bomb today wrecked a motion picture theater which has been showing a film of the battle of Ypres. Two policemen were shot, one seriously, when raiders threw the bomb. The raiders, who were armed, dashed up to the theater in an automobile, and after hurriedly throwing the bomb, had a pistol battle with the police as they were leaving.

Sinn Feiners have been stirred recently by the display of British films in Ireland. The day before Armistice Day, seven armed men raided a movie in Dublin and stole a film of the battle of Ypres. They compelled the manager to return the money to the spectators. The same day at Kingstown masked men stole a film of the Prince of Wales. On Armistice Day there were many arrests in Dublin as the result of street fights.

A more serious phase of the recent renewal of Sinn Fein activity is indicated by documents found on Sean Russell, an agitator, committed yesterday for trial under the treason act. These documents indicated that there was a secret organization to carry out reprisals in case the free state should execute any republicans.

LOST VESSEL HAD 200 ABOARD; SEAS BEING SEARCHED

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20.—A wireless message picked up today by the navy said the Haitian steamer Ville des Cayes, believed to have been wrecked with the loss of 200 lives, had been picked up by the tanker Brazos in Cuban waters. It was not indicated whether anyone was aboard the vessel which was taken in tow 13 miles east of Pilon Harbor.

The Ville des Cayes left Aux Cayes last Saturday for Santiago loaded with laborers for the sugar fields, and several of her crew have been picked up. The Brazos message gave no details as to condition of the wreck.

The planes from the American naval base at Guantanamo and several destroyers have been searching the Caribbean between Cuba and Haiti.

The engineer and two seamen, picked up by the British steamer Wanderer, have been landed at Aux Cayes.

BRUSH FIRES HALTS LIGHT AND POWER AT SANTA BARBARA

SANTA BARBARA, Cal., Nov. 20.—A call for more men to fight a raging brush fire in the lower Ojai, 35 miles from Santa Barbara, which has cut off the two main power lines of the Southern California Edison Company, leaving Santa Barbara, Montecito, Goleta, Carpinteria, Summerland and other smaller districts without light or power since last evening, was sent out by the power company this morning.

Street car service in this city is at a standstill and all business houses and commercial enterprises in this section are attempting to operate only in a meager way. All night long large forces of men fought the flames, but were powerless to make headway after the fire had spread into the Castas, where the brush had not been burned over for years.

This morning the first was raging along a five mile front and both the pole and steel tower lines of the power company had been put out of commission.

Heat with gas. DAWES ACCUSED OF ULTERIOR MOTIVES BY LABOR ORGAN

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20.—An attack on Vice-President Dawes and his plan to reform senate rules was made by the American Federation of Labor in its weekly news service.

"In favoring a gag on senate debate," the Federation said, "General Dawes has let the cat out of the bag in New York last week. He said a filibuster defeated the Muscle Shoals bill. In diplomatic terms General Dawes assured his select audience that if the bill could be jammed through the senate, as in the house, one of the country's greatest water power projects would now be in control of private exploiters."

Declaring that in the next congress reduction of surtaxes, repeal of the income publicity law, abolition of inheritance taxes, the Teapot Dome scandal and several other embarrassing subjects would come up, the Federation said these furnished a reason "for opposition to senate rules which permit the public to become acquainted with matters of vital interest to them."
