### OVR-RETTING AT STATE FLAX PLANT WILL CAUSE LOSS

(Associated Press Local Wire.) SALEM, Ore., Nov. 23.—In the same statement in which Governor Pierce yesterday announced formally the removal of Robert Crawford as superintendent of the state flax industry at the penitentiary and the appointment of John Quinlan in his place, the governor announced that profits from the 1924 crop will be about \$10,000 under the estimate. The reason given for this is that the 350 tons of straw retted during the summer of 1925, mostly from the 1924 crop, was considerably damaged from overretting. A considerable portion of it

was too short to be used for other than tow purposes. The large percentage that goes into the making of spinning tow will be worth from 10 to 20 cents a pound instead of from 10 to 23 cents that would come from the long fibre variety.

"The plant now has on hand" says the governor's statement, "1400 tons of long straw which will be made into long fibre. At the present time careful experiments are being made in artificially drying the straw after retting. There is every indication that this plan will be a success."

### SIMPLICITY MARKS FUNERAL SERVICES QUEEN ALEXANDRA

(Associated Press Local Wire.) SANDRINGHAM, England, Nov. 23.—The body of Queen Mother Alexandra lies in a little, dimly lighted church here, where it will be on view until Thursday, so that those who desire may pass by the bier and pay their respects to the beloved woman whom many of them had known or seen in Sandringham. Throughout last night four servants of the royal household watched beside the home-made coffin. No crape was to be seen inside the little church nor were the candles lighted. A few wreaths, the floral tokens of affection from the members of the royal household were placed here and there about the coffin.

Simplicity also marked the funeral service which was held later. The minister delivered a tribute to Alexandra, but did not preach a sermon. The service was attended by King George and Queen Mary and the Prince of Wales and other royal personages. With them mourned a large number of the regular members of the congregation. After the funeral services Friday in Westminster Abbey, the body of the queen mother will be taken to Windsor Castle. There, on Saturday it will be laid beside that of her husband, King Edward VII, under the Albert Memorial chapel, in which they were married in 1863.

### COUNTY SHOULD PRODUCE MORE SHEEP, GOATS

(Continued from page 1.)

Douglas County carries around 10,000 cattle on the ranches, logged off lands, and in the Forest Reserve. Cost figures show that it requires around \$20.00 per head annually to carry a breeding herd in this county. It costs around \$50.00 to produce a two year old steer. Under these costs the livestock committee feel that no one should attempt to raise beef cattle unless they are ideally situated on cheap range or have access to the National Forest, where they have plenty of good grass.

It is considered that the number of beef cattle in the county under present conditions should not be increased.

Owing to the competition coming from the low grade beef furnished from the dairy barreds of cattle, we wish to endorse the "Truth in Meat" campaign suggested by O. M. Plummer. This campaign should be entered into by those who would like to obtain quality beef, as well as those who are growing cattle and work toward a regulation stamping of meats according to grade. All consumers should be informed that beef of the best quality comes from beef bred cattle.

Sheep. Douglas County has a sheep population of 30,000 head. The predatory animals are a source of loss to sheep owners.

It is the feeling of the livestock group that sheep offer the best means of utilizing the grass of the county providing this pest can be controlled.

It is recommended that in addition to the bounty system now in force in Douglas County, that co-operation be established with the United States Biological Survey to secure the services of a Government hunter. Owing to the fact that coyotes to this county from over the mountains it is recommended that poison stations be established in the spring of the year following the snow line back with the hope of destroying these as they come in.

It is recommended that an effort be made to improve the standard of the sheep kept, by keeping good ewe lambs to replenish the flock as well as the use of good rams of mutton breeds.

The committee feels that Urupqua ranch should, by improvement, be made to bring a premium on the market such as is being done by lambs from other sections. It is suggested that as one means of establishing Urupqua lambs in the minds of the traveling public that the hotels of the county be asked to feature "Urupqua Lamb" on their menu during the lamb season.

Goats. Douglas County carries 33,000 goats which are proving profitable to the owners. The committee recommends that more Angora goats be kept as a means of improving the grading conditions by keeping down brush. Experience has shown that aside from the crop of mohair that is produced they will improve the pasture for both sheep and cattle. Control of them by fencing is necessary to secure the best results in riding the pastures of brush.

Hogs. Douglas County carries 7,500 hogs at present. Owing to the fact that hogs are not profitable where raised on grain alone it is recommended that only such numbers be kept as will be required to consume the waste produce, such as skim milk, oil fruits and grain a ton.

Horses. The committee wishes to call attention to the fact that few draft colts have been raised for some years and that the average age of draft horses on the farm is over 10 years. It is recommended that those who expect to use horses in their farming operations, should raise enough colts to take care of their own needs. It should be remembered that all sections of Oregon are faced with the same problem.
