### GYPSY SOBFEST SO INTENSE OFFICERS ARE GIVEN SCARE

NEW YORK, Nov. 25.—Frank Kaslov, "king of American gypsies," is on the way to Europe to find a gypsy princess to make his queen.  
Early today the weeping and wailing of his followers at a steamship pier caused consternation to a special detail of secret service men who were escorting the Italian debt commission, headed by Count Giuseppe Volpi, to board the Mauretania.

The count and his party were entertained at the Biltmore until after midnight, and a special guard accompanied them to the pier because of demonstrations by anti-Fascist Italians upon their arrival. Walls, screams and cries greeted the party on arrival at the pier. The Italians learned that the followers of Frank Kaslov, whose wife died a year ago, were giving him a farewell party as he set forth to find a new gypsy queen.

Gypsy law, it was explained, requires that he must have a consort of royal blood and he is going to Venice to find one. He is 42 and has six children.  
Kaslov and his escort of more than 50 gypsies arrived at the pier two hours before sailing time and went through elaborate ceremonies of grief.  
When weeping and wailing commenced in earnest Kaslov waited a few moments, then stroled among the groups urging them to restrain their grief, which then became more vehement than before.

The king's brother, John, sat on a keg and wept profusely. Two other brothers leaned against a wall while they lamented. They remained at the pier until tugs dragged the ship into the darkness.

### WET CACHE RAID YIELDS DATA ON PROHI PERSONNEL

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)  
CHICAGO, Nov. 25.—A little black book, containing a virtually complete directory of Chicago prohibition enforcement forces, found in a raid a week ago, may bring an other extensive liquor investigation here.

The volume was found in a six-story building across from the criminal court after agents had discovered whiskey and alcohol valued at \$200,000 in the establishment of J. B. Scheure and Company. Its existence was carefully guarded last night while enforcement officials endeavored to translate its code entries and check up on the information it contained.

Notations as to these prohibition agents regarded as "dangerous," those that could be "seen" and other data intimately personal concerning the enforcement staff was contained in the book. It had comments on the habits of some of the agents, with the time they generally left home in the morning and returned at night.

As a result of the book's entries, agents tested for honesty and skill with firearms, have been assigned to guard a large vault of the Scheure concern, which the raiders have been unable to open. At the time of the raid it was said that evidence had been obtained to show that liquor valued at more than \$1,000,000 a month had been passing through the Scheure plant.

WASHINGTON—The regulations of the federal reserve board requiring Federal Reserve and member banks to pay at par checks drawn up on them was sustained today by the supreme court.
