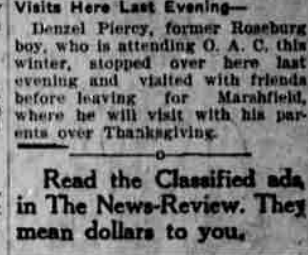
To Gold Hill—
