jail, Lloyd was kept in the Multnomah county jail until his trial. Lloyd An Ex-Convict.

Lloyd was first received at the penitentiary from Lane county on October 26, 1921, to serve two years for forgery. His home was in Cottage Grove. He was dismissed April 26, 1925, at the expiration of his minimum sentence, receiving time off for good behavior. Lloyd was 3 years old when he first entered the penitentiary.

Governor Pierce said he had received less than a dozen letters urging clemency for Lloyd. One of these letters were written by the prisoner's mother, who lives near Albany. She informed the governor that she was without funds and was unable to come to Salem and make a personal appeal in behalf of her son. Four of the writers alleged that Lloyd is mentally defective and probably was not responsible for his act.
