SCHOOL STRIKE AT FOREST GROVE IS BROUGHT TO END

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

FOREST GROVE, Ore., Dec. 1.—One hundred students of the Forest Grove high school were back at their studies this morning following a walk-out yesterday in protest of the suspension of 27 students who were said to have attended the Independence-Forest Grove football game after being ordered to remain away.

The return to school followed interviews with the members of the school board in which board members promised that the twenty-seven suspended students could return to school, without loss of credits, and that the incident would be "forgotten." It is related that the students who were forbidden to attend the football game were behind in their studies and home study was held as necessary. The game was Thanksgiving Day and upon the return to school Monday morning the 27 were ordered home and were told not to return to school until they were accompanied by their parents.

At noon yesterday a "pop" rally was held at the school and was attended by a majority of the suspended students. School officials protested and at once a meeting was held among the students and about 100 voted to leave school. They left and later in the day sent spokesmen to interview members of the school. It is said that the directors urged the students to return and that no punishment would result.

PHEASANTS FREED IN VARIOUS PARTS DOUGLAS COUNTY
Twenty-four dozen Chinese pheasants, the dozen of a shipment from the state game commission within the past week, were liberated in Douglas county today under the direction of Deputy Game Warden Ed Walker. Members of the local rod and gun club assisted in the distribution of the birds by the use of their automobiles in transportation of the crates. The birds were evenly distributed among the following localities: Drain, Elkton, Yoncalla, Sutherlin, Melrose, Coles Valley, Happy Valley and Myrtle Creek. At each place promises were received from local residents to protect them against illegal hunters. All of these pheasants are birds of last spring's hatching at Willamette valley points. They will be joined next spring by older birds which the game commission plans to trap in eastern Oregon during the heavy snows of the coming winter, thereby serving the double purpose of saving the birds from perishing and insuring good breeding stock for local propagation.

NEW YORK, Dec. 1.—Dartmouth and Pennsylvania each are accorded the distinction of placing two stars on the all-american football eleven selected today by Gilmore Doble, Cornell's head coach. For these eleven men, Doble indicates, would also represent his choice for an all-american team, the only changes necessary in his opinion being the substitution of Weir of Nebraska for Jose of Yale at tackle, Grange of Illinois for Cheek, and Nevers of Stanford for Keefer in the backfield.

CORVALLIS, Ore., Dec. 1.—Though the Oregon Aggie football team works more as a unit than as an aggregation of individual stars, a number of the most colorful players on the coast will be in orange jerseys for the final game of the season against Southern California Saturday.

Paul Snider, full back, has consistently outplayed all opponents this season, making the surprising average against Idaho of 53 yards to each boot. One kick from his own nine-yard line added 70 yards through the air from the scrum made line and rolled for a total of 110 yards from the kicker. Snider will play his final game for the Aggies this week.


Schulmerich has neither missed a try for point nor a place kick this season and in addition he passes, receives, runs the ends, plunges, and can punt if necessary. Dixon and Dickerson, tackles, have each been included on all-coast selections this year, while Edwards and Luby, quarter and half, have not failed to make sensational open field gains in every game this season.

AUSTIN, Texas, Dec. 1.—The Lee Parson Davis, counsel for Alice Beatrice Jones in the trial of the annulment suit by her husband, Leonard Kip Rhineland, said in his summation before the jury today that the couple would never live with each other again regardless of the outcome of the case.
