The U. S. Bureau of Standards recently tested some so-called standard measuring cups and found that many were not correctly divided into quarter, thirds, halves, etc., and one cup was found to be twice as large as another!

You can test your measuring cup by seeing if it holds 16 tablespoons of water. The best tablespoon to measure with is the one which you buy in the bunch of measuring spoons. Filling this, use a regulation tablespoon, not a dessert spoon.
