A SIMPLE MEAL WILL HELP First course: small servings of celery, olives and salted nuts, French rolls and butter on plate; second course: oysters on half shell, cocktail sauce; third course: soup with crackers; fourth course: sweetbread with mushrooms on a casserole; fifth course: omelet with rice dressing, cranberry sauce, candied sweet potatoes, creamed onions; sixth course: small portion of lamb and butter sauce; seventh course: ice cream and cake; eighth course: fruit-tasse. A typical table d'hote dinner. Too high in protein, fat and carbohydrates. Too low in vitamins and mineral elements. Too great a variety and so much that one is invariably over-eat. Very high in cost in health and money. We have this type of dinner often, don't we—some of us, anyway? Next Sunday, December 6, is Golden Rule Sunday. On this day, we are asked to give a little thought to the motherless and fatherless children in the orphanages of the Near East. We are asked to have a simple dinner of vegetables, corn grits, or other cereal, with milk, and some stewed apples—and donate the money we save by so doing, and as much more as we can spare, to help the Near East Relief to continue to support these children.
