## COWBOY LOVER OF HORSES TRIES TO DESTROY PACKERY

### Shot Probably Fatally by Detective After Four Previous Attempts to Burn Plant.

ROCKFORD, Mont., Dec. 5.—The affection of a Montana cowboy for the semi-wild horses of his native ranges may cost him his life. Frank Little, Miles City, Montana cowboy, learning that horses raised on a ranch where he was working were being shipped to Rockford for slaughter at a horse meat packing plant, came here with the intention of dynamiting the plant, and was seriously wounded in the attempt.

OREGON OPPOSES GOVT. CLAIM TO GRASSY ISLAND  
SALEM, Ore., Dec. 5.—A controversy over title to Grassy Island in the Columbia River has developed between the state of Oregon and the federal government as a result of an application of H. B. Evans of Portland for a survey of the island, evidently with a view to its purchase. His application was filed with the general land office in Washington, and yesterday Attorney General Van Winkle filed in the same federal department a protest on the part of the state. Valuable fishing rights are represented by the island. Van Winkle's protest contends that the island belongs to the state and not to the government.
