MAJORITY OPPOSES ONE-MAN CONTROL SHIPPING BOARD

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14—A democratic insurgent majority of the special house committee named to investigate the shipping board today reported for continuance of the board practically under existing conditions. A minority report dissenting from that view will be filed by the republican members.

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) WASHINGTON, Dec. 14—The Shipping Board refused today to turn over to the War Department two of its President type boats for transports.
