**BRAMWELL CASE IS SCHEDULED FOR ANOTHER HEARING**

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)  
SALEM, Ore., Dec. 15—As far as the state banking board is concerned the accusations made by representatives of the Portland National Bank against Frank C. Bramwell have not become a closed incident and a hearing will be held in Salem Thursday of this week at which persons testifying must talk under oath. Members of the board are unable to understand a letter received yesterday from Will E. Haines, president of the Portland bank, in which he said: "We desire to thank you for the favorable conclusion reached at the conference last Friday whereby the Portland National Bank will be approved as a reserve depository for state banks."

No such conclusion was reached, members of the board say. On the other hand, they declare, all who participated in the informal conference, including Mr. Haines, agreed that a formal hearing would be called Thursday of this week.

The Portland National Bank representatives charged that Bramwell had arbitrarily refused to grant that bank a charter to serve as a reserve depository for state banks.

"If the charges lodged against Mr. Bramwell are true," said Secretary of State Koser yesterday "the banking board would be justified in taking some action against him. If the charges are not true then the board should make a statement exonerating him in the eyes of the public. It would not be fair either to Mr. Haines or Mr. Bramwell to allow the charges to remain unexplained as they are at the present time."

In addition to the revolutionary features incorporated include white enamel wash basins in the dressing rooms, club car, "Honeyman" partitions between sections, connecting rooms, improved ventilating system, larger dressing rooms, manicure, ladies maid, shower bath, ladies lounge and barber.

"It is our plan to make the San Francisco Overland Limited as fine a train as there is in the world," said McGinnis. "Everything possible has been done to make our passengers thoroughly enjoy themselves while traveling our lines. Everything to be found in high class hotels has been incorporated in the new Overland Limited train, seven of which will operate between San Francisco and Chicago over the company's Lake Tahoe route.

"We contemplate an unusually heavy movement of tourists to Oregon and the Pacific coast this winter and we want them to travel in comfort and ease never before equalled."

The consist of the new trains include the 12-section and drawing room car for Salt Lake City, four 12-section and drawing room cars for Chicago, one 2-compartment and 3 drawing room car for Chicago and one 3-compartment and 2 drawing room observation car to Chicago.
