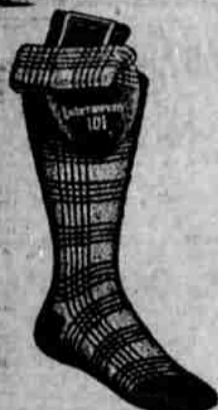

PARIS, Dec. 15.—Finance Minister Loucheur resigned today following definite rejection of his fiscal projects by the finance committee of the Chamber of Deputies.

alien radicals. He declined to recognize that the constitutional guarantee of free speech "applies to aliens who desire to come over here to teach their pernicious doctrines of communism, revolution, sabotage and destruction of orderly government."

He added that the policy of exclusion of undesirable aliens would be enforced without regard to the station of life of the persons affected. Information on which foreigners are excluded is confidential and will not be made public.
