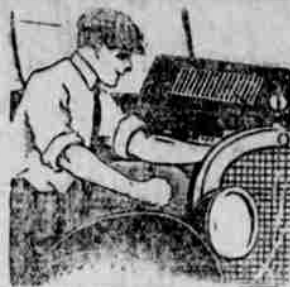

PRESENTED WITH A BUICK MASTER SIX

Fred Wagner, veteran starter of a thousand automobile races, was the most surprised man in California after the race in Culver City last month.

Soon after he waved the last driver from the track a brand new Buick Master Six sedan was presented to him by nineteen of the leading race drivers of the country. It was an expression of appreciation for Wagner's long service in auto racing.

The gift was planned by Peter DePaolo, winner of the 1925 race drivers championship. 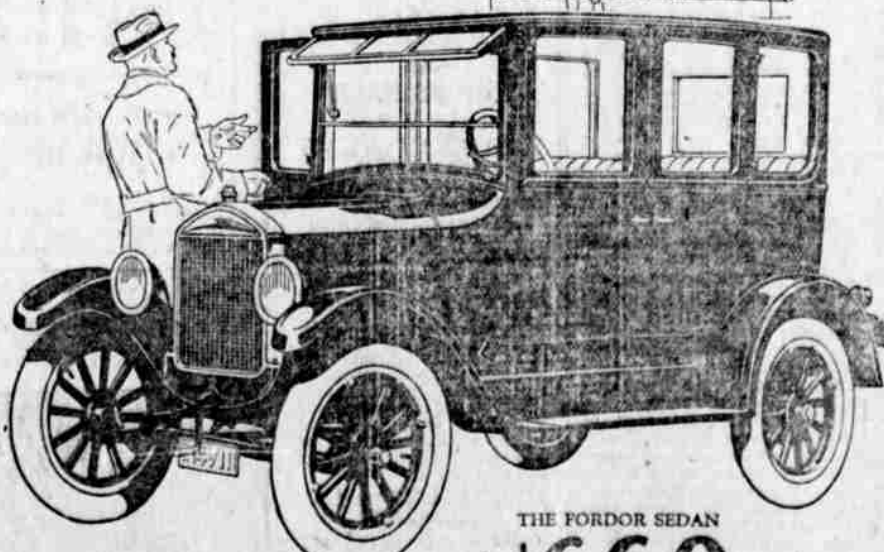

ville (Tennessee) Tennesseean, and C. J. Burnell, staff photographer of the same paper, knew that to go to press with the story of the Vanderbilt-Auburn football game without photographs would cause a howl from their football fans that could be heard to the farthest corner of the composing room.

So, for 226 miles, up half the state of Alabama and across more than half the state of Tennessee they raced against time in a Chrysler Six Phaeton. Leaving the stadium in Birmingham, Alabama, at 3:12 in the afternoon, they were in Nashville at 5:08 in the evening with photographs of the 10 to 9 Auburn victory.

The driving was done by Paul Cecil, of the Hermitage Motor Car Co., Nashville Chrysler distributor, and the actual running time was only five hours and twenty-one minutes. Although they made only 32 miles the first hour out from Birmingham, due to the deplorable condition of a long detour, they made up for it once they hit better roads. They made the distance from Columbia to Franklin, 23 miles, in 25 minutes, and from

Franklin to the city limits of Nashville, 15 miles in 19 minutes.

BIG BUSINESS IN WILLYS-OVERLAND

Continuing their high sales record of an average of more than 1000 cars a month since January 1, the Chicago factory branch of Willys-Overland and its dealers established a new mark when they held the largest single day's driveway in Chicago automobile history recently.

Dealers under the Chicago branch, who had gathered to celebrate their part in the Willys Derby, national sales contest of Willys-Overland, drove away from Chicago 463 automobiles with a total retail valuation of more than half a million dollars. A cash payment of \$248,521.71 was made by the 529 dealers in attendance to cover this huge driveway of cars which marks a continuation of exceptional sales in Illinois

territory for Willys-Overland. President John N. Willys was on hand to take part in the festivities which were held in Municipal Pier and bore all the markings of a real derby day, designated as "Willys Day" in honor of Willys-Overland's head. That the meeting was an indication of the unusual dealers success in this territory is shown by the registration figures in Illinois which rates Willys-Overland third in the number of cars registered in the state and with the same position in Cook county.

More than 11,000 automobiles were delivered to Chicago dealers in the period from January 1 to November 1 with a total retail value of more than \$14,000,000. Willys-Overland's September and October deliveries from the Chicago branch totaled 2292 automobiles this year, representing an increase of practically 100 per cent over the corresponding period of 1924.
