GERMAN FASCISTS SEEKING LIFE OF HERR STRESEMANN

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
BERLIN, Dec. 17.—That Herr Stresemann must be killed, is a passage in a letter, the discovery of which led to revelation of the plot to assassinate Germany's foreign minister.

Two German Fascists named Kalldorff and Lorenz are under arrest. They are alleged to have perfected their plans to the point of providing for disguises and a getaway in motor cars and an airplane after the assassination.

That this was not the first attempt against the foreign minister was revealed by his newspaper, the Taegische Rundschau.

On the anniversary of the assassination of Dr. Walter Rathenau (who was killed June 24, 1922) the paper says, several persons hid in the garden of the foreign minister and fired a number of shots at Dr. Stresemann, but without effect. Police who searched the garden were unable to find the criminals.

Another plot was revealed a few days before the departure of the German delegation for the recent Locarno security conference but the vigilance of the Munich and Berlin police prevented the attempt.

GULLION FLAYS WITHOUT MERCY TO UPHOLD ARMY

the only logical head of it."

"That," the major said, "is the formula he has followed. Every demagogue has followed a similar one, protesting unpopularity and secretly seeking self-aggrandizement as he appealed directly to the people over the heads of constituted authority."

Mitchell is Analyzed.

"Is this man a Moses, fitted to lead the people out of a wilderness which is his own creation only? Is he of the George Washington type counsel would have you believe? Is he not rather of the all-too-familiar charlatan and demagogue type? * * * He is a good flyer, a fair rider, a good shot, flamboyant, self-advertising, wildly imaginative, destructive, never constructive except in wild non-sensical schemes, and never overly careful as to the ethics of his methods."

"This court has had opportunity to study those methods. Not only as revealed in his statements of the fifth and sixth, but also in his former statements which his counsel has read into the record. All of these statements made over a per-

lot of years follow what we may term the Mitchell formula."

Army Needs Loyalty.
Stating why he believed Colonel Mitchell should be dismissed from the army, Major Gullion said:

"There are certain elementary principles of loyalty and subordination which every organization must maintain if it is to remain a going concern. These elementary principles are really laws of organization and are strictly observed by corporations and religious bodies. Not one of these would tolerate such conduct as the accused's. Dismissal would be his portion. How much more necessary is it for members of the army to follow those laws of organization? Dismissal from the army for such conduct is therefore positively indicated."

"There are certain fundamental rules of human conduct which control all cooperative associations. One of the most important of these rules requires that serious charges against one's fellows must not be made groundlessly. By his untimely attacks on the honor of his associates the accused has violated that rule and would be expelled from any such association."

Demotion and Reproof Unfit.
"Would an admonishment fit the offenses of which the accused has been clearly proven guilty? For making statements which his counsel read into the record, statements similar, but not as bad as those of September 5th and 9th the accused's chief, General Patrick, recommended that he be admonished. Encouraged by such leniency he has now gone to the unforgivable extreme. * * *

"Would a reduction in files be a suitable punishment? It would hardly be punishment at all. The accused is a colonel and promotion from that grade is not made by seniority. * * *

"What punishment would, under the custom of our service, be meted out to a soldier with only a sixth grade education who had committed the offense of which the accused has been proven guilty? Confinement in labor most certainly. How then can this unpunished accused with all his advantages of education and position be let off with less than dismissal?"

Major Gullion admitted that it was not known "just how seriously the accused's conduct has actually prejudiced discipline" and told the court "it does not seem known" to enable it to reach a finding.

"Our soldiers are watching this case," he said, "and to dismiss him and you weaken the authority of every non-commissioned officer in the service. Dismiss him as he deserves and you strengthen the arm of every single officer commanding a one company post from Marfa to Nogales."
