DOUMER TRYING TO UNWIND TANGLE OF FRENCH FINANCES

PARIS, Dec. 17.—Paul Doumer, the new minister of finance, has been busy installing in office and has begun his work to aid France in making its way out of the financial slough.

His first care will be to accelerate the voting of the budget by parliament. He will leave other financial problems to be dealt with later in their proper order.

M. Doumer's program will have the seal of approval of the entire government before it is published. It therefore will not be the finance minister's plan, but the government's plan, and its rejection will entail the resignation of the Briand government.

PEAR GROWER SAYS CAR SHORTAGE DUE TO VOLSTEAD LAW

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

MEDFORD, Ore., Dec. 15.—A statement that the Volstead Act is responsible for the car shortage in Oregon was made at the pear meeting here today by B. W. Johnson, a prominent pear grower of Monroe, Ore., who delivered a response on behalf of the State Horticultural Society to the welcome delivered by Mayor O. O. Alenderfer.

"The Volstead Act," said Mr.

Johnson, "has so increased the shipments of wine grapes from California that the railroads cannot keep up with the demand for cars and therefore a car shortage in Oregon is almost inevitable."

"In 1923 California shipped 41,000 tons of grapes and this year they shipped \$5,000 tons. The solution is for California to stop shipping grapes and ship grape juice only. This would cut down the car demand materially."

Following Mr. Johnson's remarks, a local minister arose and suggested that speakers confine their remarks to the subject at hand. It was explained to the minister that Mr. Johnson made no statement either for or against prohibition or the Volstead Act.
