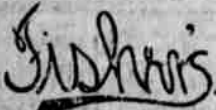

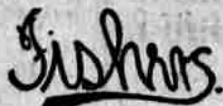

SOVIET CALLS FOR DISARMAMENT AND END OF TALKFEST

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) PARIS, Dec. 17.—An official invitation to participate in the work of preparing for an international disarmament conference was sent to the Russian Soviet government today through Premier Briand as president of the League of Nations council. Foreign Minister Tchitcherin of Soviet Russia, visiting Paris, was quoted on Tuesday as declaring to the newspapermen: "The Soviet cannot accept the invitation to the preparatory disarmament conference because we fear it will prove only dilatory interference. We hold that disarmament should proceed at once. We have already expressed our willingness to take the part in a real disarmament discussion. We are against years of security discussion as preliminary to disarmament."

NO PLEA BEFORE MILITARY BODY FOR MITCHELL

(Continued from Page 1.) The evidence before this court bears out these facts in their entirety. It has been shown that at present we have only one standard plane in the service. "Secretary Weeks and indirectly the President were wrongly and untruthfully informed as to the condition of our aviation and our national defense by the persons furnishing the data on which his letter was based. "This court has refrained from ruling whether the truth in this case constitutes an absolute defense or not. "To proceed further with the case would serve no useful purpose. "I have therefore directed my counsel to entirely close our part of the proceedings without argument."

Head Hunters Outdone.

After the defense counsel had again refused to make a closing argument, Colonel Sherman Moreland, chief of the prosecution counsel, summoned up the evidence. He declared that it was not necessary to prove that any breach of discipline actually had resulted from Colonel Mitchell's conduct. "All that is required is to prove the statement (Colonel Mitchell's statement attacking the war and navy departments) and the publication thereof," he added, "and there our responsibility rests." The truth or falsity of the Mitchell statement, he contended, did not establish a defense for the accused under provisions of the court martial manual. Colonel Mitchell's statement, said the prosecutor, had been issued at San Antonio at a time chosen "to strike the hearts and souls of the people" while they were horrified at the Shenandoah disaster. Within 36 hours after the wreck of the dirigible he continued, the Associated Press had received the statement to more than 1200 newspapers throughout the country. The prosecution counsel compared Colonel Mitchell's tactics to those of Filipino savages. "When it comes to head hunting in the United States army," he said, "it is time for the army to disband."
