Pepper Relish for Immediate Use: Mix together one minced and uncooked head of cabbage and six large green sweet peppers which have been boiled in salted water for ten minutes with seeds removed, then chopped. Drain for a few minutes, then add one cup of granulated sugar, a scant one-fourth cup of salt, two tablespoons of mustard seed and enough cold vinegar to cover. Use at once.

Quick Beet Relish: Mix together one quart of cooked, chopped beets, one quart of chopped raw cabbage, one and one-half cups of granulated sugar, one teaspoon of salt, one and one-fourth cups of vinegar and one bottle of horseradish. (No cooking required). Ready to serve at once.
