NEWSY BITS

Wine and fruit futures made in Southern California under government permit and valued at more than \$7,000,000 will be destroyed within the next few weeks, in accordance with a new government ruling cancelling all such permits.

The Ku Klux Klan has been permanently enjoined from parading in Kansas by a decision of Judge M. A. Bender of Oskaloosa. The issue arose out of a parade of the Klan at Valley Falls a year ago, which was planned as a part of the Jefferson county fair. Protests were filed by Catholic and Jewish citizens on the ground that the county fair was "for the benefit of all citizens" and that taxpayers should not be forced to pay for demonstrations staged by the Ku Klux Klan.

George W. English, a federal judge for the eastern district of Illinois, is guilty of "high crimes and misdemeanors" and should be impeached, according to the report of a special committee of Congress named to investigate the charges against him. Judge English was accused before the committee of allowing C. B. Thomas, referee in bankruptcy in his court, to represent private companies in litigation; of disbaring attorneys without due process of law and of using improper language from the bench.

75 WAGON LOADS DAILY OF TURKEYS—CHICAGO

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) CHICAGO, Dec. 21.—Christmas has supplanted Thanksgiving as "turkey time" in the opinion of Chicago poultry dealers. One of the largest poultry wholesale houses in Chicago has been unloading an average of 75 wagons of barrelled and boxed turkeys daily for more than a week or a total daily average of 250,000 pounds.

KING IN RED SEA DISTRICT OUSTED FROM HIS THRONE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) PORT SUDAN, Egypt, Dec. 21.—Still another crown has toppled. It is that of King Ali of the Hedjaz, a territory lying partly along the Red Sea in Arabia, known as "the land of pilgrimage" and which embraces the Holy city of Mecca. Ali, like his father, King Hussein, has abdicated.

Since Ali ascended the throne in October of last year he has been sorely beset by Ibn Saoud, head of the sultanate of Nejd, in warfare that has been almost continuous since 1919. The Wahabi tribesmen frequently made attacks against which the Hedjaz warriors were unable to cope.

While Hussein still was on the throne, Mecca was taken by the followers of Ibn Saoud and Hussein abdicated in favor of Ali, evacuating Mecca in order to save the holy city from complete destruction. All went to Medina and when that town fell he proceeded to Jeddah.

Ibn Saoud continued relentlessly and began plans for his invasion of Jeddah. The Wahabis made the town a target for ferocious attacks and finally, last Friday, the defenses virtually collapsed and Ali later abdicated the throne he had occupied for little more than a year.

LONDON, Dec. 21.—Doubt is cast upon the report from Port Sudan of the abdication of King Ali of the Hedjaz in dispatches received here. The Daily Mail's Cairo correspondent, referring to the report says it is contradicted from trustworthy sources. Another message also suggests it is doubtful.

SURVEYOR WHO LAID OUT COAST ROAD IS DEAD

Chester A. Beaman, the engineer who was most active in locating the Scottsburg-Bendport section of the Umpqua highway, died at Coquille on December 18 and was buried at Scottsburg last Friday. Mr. Beaman, a native of Oregon, was considered one of the best engineers of the state, and while employed by Douglas county undertook one of the most difficult and dangerous tasks which road engineers have faced. In locating the coast road engineers were swung, suspended by ropes, over high cliffs. Because of his demonstrated ability Mr. Beaman was employed by the government. This position, however, entailed a great deal of eyestrain, and as Mr. Beaman was suffering from injuries sustained in a dynamite explosion, he resigned from the government job and accepted a position with Coos county.

Chester Arthur Beaman was born in Oregon City, Oregon, Dec. 1, 1881. He with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Beaman, moved to Elkton, Oregon, when he was 12 years of age. He united with the Christian church at Elkton when he was 13 years of age, during the ministry of Rev. Ross. He was united in matrimony with Violet Sawyers June 2nd, 1917. He was a World War veteran, enlisting in the 23rd Engineers and served overseas.

After his return he made his home at Scottsburg until the last year when he made his home at Coquille, Oregon, where he was engineer of Coos county. He died at his home Dec. 14, 1925. Age 49 years and 14 days.

He leaves to survive him, his wife and two children; one son, Chester Arthur and one daughter, Hazel. Two brothers, Pearl Beaman of Raymond, Wash., and Perry Beaman of St. Helens. Three sisters, Mrs. C. J. Alexander of Portland, Ore., Mrs. W. K. Lytle of Portland, Ore., and Mrs. Lulu Ingle of The Dalles, besides many other relatives and a host of friends to mourn his loss. Interment took place in the Scottsburg cemetery, Dec. 18, 1925. Rev. Miss Driver, of Elkton, officiated.
