DEMPESEY SIGNS NEW AGREEMENT TO MEET WILLS

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 21.—Jack Dempsey, champion heavyweight fighter, and Floyd Fitzsimmons, promoter of the Dempsey-Wills match, agreed today to new terms for a bout next fall. Fitzsimmons will pay a substantial amount "on account" and the champion will post a large bond to insure his appearance in the ring.
The new articles of agreement are to take place of those signed last summer, under which a South Bend syndicate was to back Fitzsimmons in staging the fight at Michigan City, Ind.
Under the new agreement the champion is said to have the same purse guarantee as was promised him for the fight at Michigan City. The bout, according to the latest plans, may be staged in Michigan City or any other town of several states where conditions and boxing regulations are favorable.

ED RAND, DEPUTY FIRE MARSHALL, IS CALLED BY DEATH

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 21.—Ed Rand, deputy state fire marshal and one of the most widely known characters in Oregon, died from a heart attack yesterday at Baker.
His body was brought to Portland last night. Rand, who was 62, had been a resident of Oregon 40 years. He first settled in Hood River where he married and during the gold excitement went to Sumpter. He was appointed chief of police and soon established a reputation for law enforcement. Later he moved to Baker where he was elected sheriff of Baker county and served for years, following which he was chief of police of Baker.
During the war Rand served as an agent for the internal revenue department with headquarters here. He then returned to Baker where he served as chief of police "in a clean-up campaign." He returned here and for three years has been a deputy state fire marshal.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21.—An increase of \$180,217 in reclamation funds through receipts from sales of public lands during the third quarter of 1925 was announced today by the Interior Department. Utah showed the largest receipts with \$47,157; Washington and Wyoming were second and third, while Oklahoma had the smallest with \$256.

EX-CONVICTS, ONE FROM OREGON, FACE CHARGE IN FRISCO

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 21.—Donald Kelly, alias Ernest Young, and L. O. Gillian, alias Jack Raymond, are being held in jail here on charges of attempted robbery. Both are ex-convicts, according to police records. Kelly was released from Oregon state penitentiary on a conditional pardon last July. Gillian was convicted of robbery here in 1922, and was released on two years probation. Both men said they had been working in Oregon before coming to Oakland, where they were arrested.
Kelly's wife, Grace, step-daughter of A. W. Stenn, of Medford, Ore., is being cared for at a detention home. She married Kelly at Medford December 7.
Lena, Gillian's wife, is being housed by the Salvation army until she can find employment. Both women declared their intentions of standing by their husbands.

MEDFORD, Ore., Dec. 21.—The records of the county clerk show that marriage license was issued on December 7, to Donald Kelly to wed Grace Severn, and L. O. Gillian appeared as a witness. The couple, the marriage return shows, were married by the Rev. E. P. Lawrence, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, at the parsonage the same day.
The local police have requested California authorities to question Kelly and Gillian relative to the holdup in this city early this month of J. Wilnot, service station proprietor who was relieved at \$40 of the point of a gun. According to Chief of Police Adams, the pair were known to him, and suspected of the holdup after its commission.

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 21.—Records at the Oregon penitentiary show that Kelly was received here November 22, 1924, to serve a sentence of five years for assault with intent to commit robbery in Multnomah county. His prison record was good and he was released on a conditional pardon from the governor, July 26, this year.

DRY CLEANING OF SCHOOL CHILDREN'S CLOTHES IS URGED

A national campaign directed toward the cleaning of the outer clothing of school children before the opening of the coming term of school is being started by master cleaners all over the country. Special rates on the cleaning and pressing of the clothes of school children will be granted during the week from Dec. 23 to January 2.

Statistics show, it is claimed, that there are 500 cases of disease during the second term of school to one case during the first term. The cleaners say that this is partially due to the lack of attention given the clothing of the children. School rooms are infested and the personal health of the children given attention, but people do not think of the disease germs lurking in the outer clothing of the youngsters.

Modern dry cleaning methods, it is said, reduce contagion by killing all disease germs so that the health of the child is protected.
