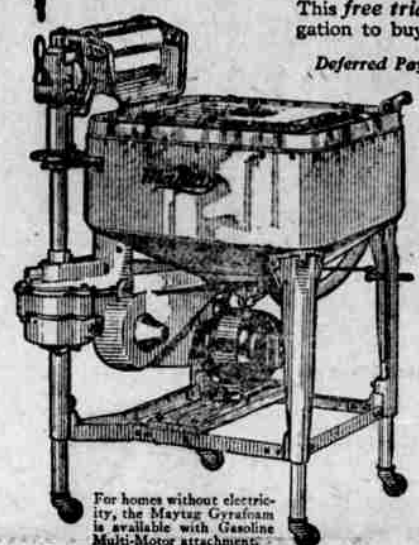

OREGON SHERIFF'S MURDERER TO PAY PENALTY OF DEATH

(Associated Press Local Wire.) SALEM, Ore., Dec. 22.—Archie Cody, slayer of Sheriff Austin Goodman of Harney county on August 27, 1924, must pay the death penalty for his crime. The state supreme court today, in an opinion by Justice Coshaw, affirmed the lower court, which convicted him of murder in the first degree, and the sentence to hang imposed by Judge Dalton Biggs.

The crime grew out of a transaction in which Cody bought two horses from a man named Cawfield in Harney county, giving in return a bad check on a bank at Elko, Nevada, signing it with the name Fried Yerdlow. Subsequently the sheriff went to the Polock farm in Harney county and placed Cody under arrest. Cody asked permission to get his saddle before going with the sheriff and while doing so he armed himself. In an exchange of shots the sheriff was wounded in the thigh and bled to death. Cody fled and was arrested the following day. Cody must now, on official order, be removed from the state penitentiary to Burns where he will be resentenced to hang.

Heat with gas STORM AUGMENTS WOES OF FRANCE

(Associated Press Local Wire.) PARIS, Dec. 22.—Two deaths, scores of injuries and material damage of several million francs resulted from a storm of hurricane intensity which swept France last night.

The storm began early in December and has raged ever since. The center of last night's hurricane was the coast of Normandy, where the deaths occurred. In Paris the Eiffel Tower station at midnight registered a southwesterly wind of 100 miles an hour. The streets were strewn with wreckage of signs from store fronts, chimneys and roofing slates. Near St. Nazaire an English steamer was driven ashore.

PARIS, Dec. 22.—The Basel-Paris express is reported to have been derailed at Noisy-Le-Lec, department of the Seine, with some loss of life. One report says it is feared 50 persons have been killed.

STOCKHOLM, Dec. 22.—Traffic throughout Sweden was dislocated today in consequence of a violent blizzard. Three members of a rescue party were drowned while attempting to save the crew of the German steamer Poseidon, which foundered off the Gotland coast. The fate of the crew is unknown. Two Swedish motorships are stranded in Stockholm waters. The storm drove ice into the harbors, halting navigation.

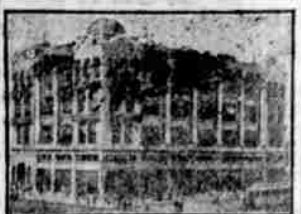
Heat with gas. SHORT MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD LAST NIGHT

The mid-month council meeting held last night proved to be a short session with an early adjournment.

Contractor Halstead appeared and reached a compromise with the council for the settlement of paving on East 4th street. There is one show panel on the street in which, through an error, the workmen failed to put enough concrete, according to the city inspector. The city refused to pay for the section, and rather than tear it out and replace it the contractor agreed to eliminate the section from the cost of the job. The electric light committee reported that the street lights had been cleared, and the action of the committee in ordering this work done was ratified.

The city recorder was authorized to purchase stamps for the office. Final estimates were allowed on Roberts, East 4th and Riverside street paving jobs. A few minor matters were discussed, but no action taken, the meeting ending at an early hour.

RIVER SWOLLEN BY RAIN AND SNOW

In spite of the fact that the rainfall for the month of December is below the average, and in fact the precipitation for the entire wet season is under the normal, the South Umpqua River, which flows through Roseburg has been rising rapidly during the past 48 hours, indicating rapidly falling and melting snows in the higher altitudes. The river has been extremely low until the end of last week, when it came up slightly. Rains of Sunday and Monday have caused it to rise to slightly above the normal mark. According to reports from the weather bureau station, the weather up to the present time has been unusually mild for December. The coldest temperature recorded since the first of January was on December 15, when the mercury dropped to 31 degrees, the only time during 1925 that the freezing mark was reached.

(Associated Press Local Wire.) DENVER, Dec. 22.—Professor Archer H. Hulbert, director of the Stewart commission on western history, a foundation at Colorado College of Colorado Springs, has announced the completion of mapping the original Oregon trail from Independence, Mo., to The Dalles, Ore. Dr. Hulbert said his mapping survey disclosed that the old trail was 2264 miles in length, 150 miles longer than the modern trail.
