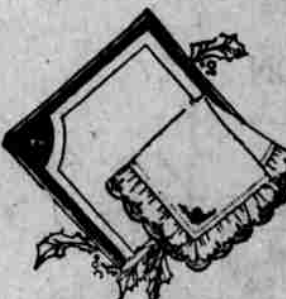

After taking it into the reservation, where he was arrested by Indian police, Joe Samuels, his cousin, who was with him, was fined \$100 for only riding with Peter to his camp. **COOLIDGE AND BORAH AGREE ON ACCEPTANCE OF LEAGUE INVITATION**

(Associated Press Lland Wire.)  
WASHINGTON, Dec. 23.—President Coolidge has progressed so far in his effort to find a way to accept the League of Nations invitation to a preliminary disarmament discussion that he has asked congressional leaders whether an appropriation would be necessary. Both Secretary Kellogg and Chairman Borah of the senate foreign relations committee conferred with President Coolidge and there were indications that a decision virtually had been reached, although the American reply to the league invitation would not be forwarded until after the holidays. Senator Borah said as he left the White House that he was in complete accord with the President's views, but he did not indicate definitely what those views were. In other quarters it was suggested that congress probably would be asked to express its opinion on the subject, at least to the extent of making an appropriation to defray the expenses of an American delegation. Senator Borah previously has favored the submission of the question to congress.
