



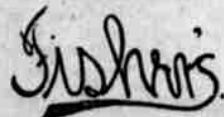

(Continued from Page 1.) garding cotton and wheat. "If we had tried to raise the price of wheat to a starving Europe," says the Morning Post, "we shouldn't have the face to complain of limitation of the price of rubber."

The Daily News finds American indignation "distinctly amusing," and adds: "If England is laughing up her sleeve it is the first time since the war that she has had the opportunity."

The Westminster Gazette comments: "It is difficult to maintain patience with a protest which seems mainly motivated by a fear that, through the sale of the commodity America must buy from us, we

shall secure means of paying our debt to her."
