FARM POINTERS Growers in Oregon who plan to plant strawberries the coming season are warned by the department of entomology of the experiment station against purchasing plants infested with the strawberry root weevil.

Red raspberry growers of Oregon who have had difficulty with western red raspberry rust and are removing old canes at this time, will find it practical to cut canes as close to the ground as possible. Much of the winter stage of this rust is carried over in small cankers at the base of old canes.

Mineral mixtures are necessary for hogs if they are to reach their best development, advises H. A. Lindgren, extension specialist in animal husbandry at the Oregon Agricultural college.

HEALTH BULLETIN

As a number of cases of meningitis have been reported in Oregon, it is important that everyone should be informed in regard to measures for its prevention.

Two epidemics have been reported, one at Cochran and the other at Klamath Falls. Epidemic meningitis was not recognized until the beginning of the nineteenth century. The first outbreak occurred in 1804 in New England States and Kentucky.
