HARTLEY VETOES 6 BILLS INCREASING FUND FOR SCHOOLS

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
OLYMPIA, Wash., Dec. 24.—Governor Hartley vetoed six bills today, including a measure increasing the millage for the University of Washington, Washington State College and the three state normal schools and the supplemental bill approximately \$1,300,000 out of the general fund for the operation of the schools.
This was believed to be the largest number of bills ever vetoed at one time by any governor of Washington. The measures had been passed by a special session of the state legislature, which adjourned last Tuesday until next Monday for a Christmas recess.

PRIESTS MAY TAKE HAND IN PLANS TO END COAL STRIKE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
SCRANTON, Pa., Dec. 24.—Non-English speaking priests of Lackawanna and Luzerne counties favor arbitration only when other plans fail. Rev. Michael Bernita, pastor of All Saints Church, Dunmore, Pa., said today, with reference of the letter of sixteen non-English speaking clergymen to the miners and operators, asking them to end the coal strike.
Father Bernita, one of the sixteen signatories, declared that the priests believe the miners are entitled to higher wages and in fact, twice as much as they are getting.
"The main object of the priests is to settle the strike as quickly as possible because of the suffering that is in our midst," he said.
John L. Lewis, president of the United Mine Workers, has notified Mayor John Durkin, chairman of the anthracite committee of mayors and burgesses, that the miners are willing to meet the operators in conference to discuss any plan for peace, it was learned today.

HARRISBURG, Pa., Dec. 24.—State funds are being deposited in banks of the local fields to take the place of savings drawn by the miners. Samuel S. Lewis, state treasurer, today said this is being done so far as possible in both the anthracite region, where the mining operations have been at a standstill since September 1, and in the bituminous section.
Approximately \$5,000,000 has been deposited with special attention to coal producing counties.
"To my mind it is to the best interest of the whole state to assist the banking institutions in the coal regions," he commented.

MOUNT CARMEL, Pa., Dec. 24.—The Kiwanis Club here will open a soup kitchen immediately after Christmas, to relieve the suffering and hunger brought about by the suspension of the anthracite mines. Much suffering is reported among miners.

FRENCH AND REBEL DRUSES REPORTED AGREED ON PEACE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
CAIRO, Egypt, Dec. 24.—An armistice is reported to have been signed between the Druse tribesmen and the new French high commissioner in Syria, Henry de Jouvenel. All prisoners held by the French authorities in Syria, on political charges are to be liberated, the report added.

LONDON, Dec. 24.—Cabling from Damascus Wednesday, Reuters special correspondent in Syria said the French were endeavoring to speed their peace negotiations with the Druses. They were moved by disquieting rumors regarding the situation on the northern frontier, where Turkish hands were reported to be massing. The Turks, it was said, had even occupied some of the French posts.
The French peace delegation which conferred with the leaders of the Druse tribesmen had returned to Damascus, the correspondent said. They regarded the prospects of peace as hopeful.
Brigands were active on the outskirts of the city and some penetrated the Chagour quarter the day the dispatch was filed.
