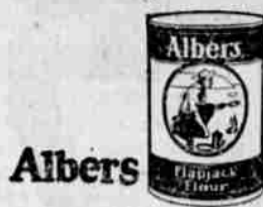
**Returns to California**—

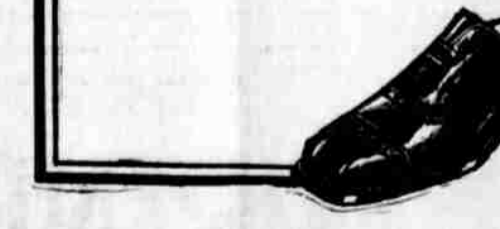
