HENRY FORDS CONTRACTS FOR AIR MAIL SERVICE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) CLEVELAND, Jan. 7.—Air mail service between Cleveland and Detroit is to begin February 1, under a contract signed by Henry Ford, Cleveland air mail officials announced today.

Schedules call for a 90-mile an hour average flying time between Detroit and Cleveland. Planes now making daily trips with Ford correspondence and freight will carry the mail, their schedules being moved up so that Detroit mail may connect with Chicago and New York planes.

PLOT TO RESTORE KING STARTS ROW AMONG HUNGARIANS

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) BUDAPEST, Jan. 7.—A report that there is a plot to restore the throne of Hungary is in circulation. On the one side it is asserted that the Fascist propose to endeavor to give the crown to Archduke Albrecht, while the legitimists are supporting Prince Otto, son of the late King Charles.

The latter report had its origin in Vienna, where a newspaper asserted that the leader of the Hungarian fascists, Julius Gombos, was some fifty miles southeast of Budapest gathering together men for a march on the capital within two or three days. It was added that Count Bethlen, the Hungarian premier, was conferring with leading legitimists for the purpose of devising means to put down Fascist attacks and elevate Otto to the throne.

Closely connected with the talk of the re-establishment of the monarchy is the 20,000,000,000 franc note case. The Socialists charge the Fascists are at the bottom of the counterfeiting plot and that the money obtained through the putting of spurious French notes into circulation was to be used in financing Albrecht's ambition.

Since Admiral Horthy as regent delivered up Emperor Charles to the powers, who banished him to Madeira, where he died, Premier Bethlen has been wrathful against the regent. The counterfeiting case is said to have given him a chance for revenge.

He set at liberty Edmundy Beniczky, former minister of the interior on the day Windisch-Graetz was imprisoned. Beniczky has accused Horthy of being indirectly a murderer.

Antlers Theatre The combination of cast and story in "The Coming of Amos," the Cecil B. DeMille supervised production which opens at the Antlers theatre tonight for a one day run, makes this offering from the DeMille studio one of the bamer pictures of the year.

Headed by Rod La Rocque, who is starring in the title role, the list of players in this Producers Distributing Corporation release is unusually brilliant. Jetta Goudal as a Russian princess in a colorful role, Noah Beery as the villain, and Trixie Friganza, Richard Carle and Clarence Burton in other featured roles make up the excellent supporting cast.

The story, adapted from William J. Locke's season's best seller, is a melodramatic comedy, adapted by Garrett Fort and James Greelman, scenarists of recognized ability. The picture swings between tense dramatic situations and humorous incidents, with gorgeous spectacles of life on the Riviera as colorful background for the unusual story.

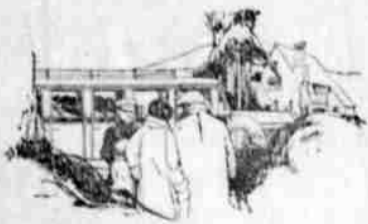

PETITION IS OUT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF NEW BRIDGE

A petition asking the county court to construct a bridge over the Umpqua river between Elkton and Kellogg, replacing the present Smith Ferry, is being circulated in the county and frosty signed. The road which such a bridge would serve, was laid out in 1862 and the ferry has been maintained for more than 60 years. The road is used as a daily mail route and serves a great number of families. The road and school districts which would be affected by the improvement are enterprising districts which have voted special taxes for road and school purposes for many years to provide of their own. The bridge would likewise serve a road, which would connect Roseburg with the Redport highway.

FRISCO BAY ZONE ROCKED BY QUAKE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 7.—A sharp earthquake was felt in the San Francisco Bay region at 8:54 o'clock last night. The distinct shocks, lasting about five seconds, were felt in Oakland, while San Francisco and points south along the peninsula received a sharp shock. The shock was sufficiently intense in some districts to rattle windows and sway pictures on the walls. In Marin county, north of here, residents at the foot of Mount Tamalpais received a sharp shock lasting several seconds. No damage was done.

PILLING DOWNS KRUISE.

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) PENDLETON, Ore., Jan. 7.—Bob Krize of Portland, ex-amateur light heavyweight wrestling champion, lost a whirlwind match here last night to Frank Pilling of Pendleton. Krize dropped the first fall in 16 minutes after Pilling had put on a series of headlocks, but won the second in 11 minutes with a Japanese arm scissors. Pilling, a Studebaker builds no year models, came back strong and won the third and deciding fall in three minutes with a hammerlock. Krize was handicapped by bolts on his left arm and it was almost useless.
