FARM BOARD AND ORGANIZATION IS URGED BY LOWDEN

(Associated Press Local Wire.)
LINCOLN, Neb., Jan. 7.—Creation of a federal farm board and the organization of producers into representative cooperative bodies to be incorporated for the purpose of caring for the agricultural surplus was suggested by Frank O. Lowden, former governor of Illinois, before representatives of a dozen farm organizations here today.

Lowden said that "agriculture was sadly out of gear with other parts of our industrial structure and that organization was the farmer's means to gain his place."

"Suppose we had a federal farm board," he continued. "Suppose that board found the producers of farm commodity were sufficiently organized so as to be representative of all producers of that commodity. Suppose that when it ascertained this fact, it should authorize such producers to form a corporation for taking care of the surplus, either storing it to meet a possible future domestic need or exporting it upon the best terms available, the expenses and losses incurred for storage or in export to be borne proportionately by all producers of that particular commodity."

"Such a board could function successfully, in my opinion, only if operated through and in hearty sympathy with the cooperative commodity associations."

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 7.—William E. Wolfe, found guilty yesterday of sending infamous literature through the mails, was sentenced to ten years in a federal penitentiary to be designated later.

A committee of physicians, at the request of the court, examined Wolfe and found him sane. Wolfe sent a number of circulars through the mails indirectly threatening the President and other high government officials. He was sought for more than three years before he was located in an Oakland rooming house.
