DETROIT, Jan. 7.—The Michigan grapegrower has been a chief beneficiary of prohibition, not because of a demand for grapes for wine-making, but because of the creation of a national thirst for grapejuice, said Searapin Bruno, a well known grower of western Michigan.

Grape prices have soared since prohibition almost entirely due to increased demand from grape juice manufacturers, Bruno asserted.
