SALEM, Ore., Jan. 12.—With the strain of his work steadily undermining his health, which has been poor for the past year, Harwood Hall, superintendent of the Chemawa Indian school for the past ten years, has asked to be relieved and will retire from the Indian service, in which he has served 40 years, as soon as formal notice of acceptance of his resignation is received from Washington.
