STATE MAY TRY TO USE FORCE ON ASSESSORS

(Continued from Page 1.)

C. C. Chapman was asked to furnish data relative to the taxation of intangibles as employed in some states. There was some sentiment in the committee in favor of repeal of the law taxing money, notes and accounts for the reason that they are taxed in some counties and not in others, and there was doubt as to the practicability of the law. Kay and A. A. Smith of Baker favored repeal of the law.

That many of the county assessors are not competent to fix valuations properly was the opinion of the committee, but it was deemed impossible to fix qualifications by law.

Equitable taxation that would increase the state's valuations, it was held, would make necessary a revision of the millage levies.

How the state's tax system may be revised and at the same time not put the state at a disadvantage as compared with Washington and California is a problem that was bothering the committee at the noon adjournment.

The committee organized by electing Governor Pierce chairman and Earl Fisher, secretary. Other members are Secretary of State Koser, State Treasurer Kay, John Carlin of Medford, Harry Corbett of Portland, A. A. Smith of Baker and Carl D. Shoemaker of Portland. Corbett was not present.

BLOOD HOUNDS ARE USED IN EFFORT TO TRACK SLAYERS

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

LONGVIEW, Wash., Jan. 25.—

Hope was renewed today for the apprehension of the two men who shot and probably fatally wounded Policeman Dwight Bailey of the Kelso police force early Saturday morning. Blood hounds from Milton, Oregon, in charge of Deputy Sheriff Glenn Sloat of Hood River, hit a new trail last night that led to the Longview, Portland and Northern railway bridge across the Cowlitz.

Finger prints similar to those detected near the scene of the shooting were found in the area. Yesterday at 2 p. m., a tall and a short man wanted to cross the railway bridge but the bridge tender refused to close the span for them.

They answered the description of the men who did the shooting. At 1 a. m. today some shooting was heard in the undeveloped area near the bridge. Dogs were taken to that section again this morning.

Late this morning a report was received that two men had broken into the barn of Senator Frank G. Barnes, and had milked a cow. A posse of from 25 to 30 men has surrounded a swamp area a distance from the barn where the men are believed to be hiding. If the suspects fail to give themselves up when called upon the men have orders to shoot.
