CLUB IS HELD OVER MITCHELL, COUNSEL SAYS

Attempt Being Made by Unjust Sentence to Muzzle Officer.

HASTE CONDEMNED

Representative Reid Claims Sentence Imposed on Former Air Officer "Un-American."

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) WASHINGTON, Jan. 26.—Stripped of his rank as colonel in the army air service, William Mitchell, today began serving his sentence of suspension from the army for five years.

Contrary, however, to the decision of the court martial which convicted him of insubordination in connection with his determined fight for a unified air service, Mitchell will receive half pay and certain living allowances during the suspension.

President Coolidge, in affirming the court's verdict stipulated yesterday that the sentence would be executed as ordered except as to the provision depriving the ex-colonel of all pay and allowances. Under the President's decision, Mitchell will receive \$357.67 monthly "during the pleasure of the President."

Mitchell has met the new situation without comment. His counsel, Representative Reid, Republican, of Illinois, however, in a statement, declared "They have finally 'got' Colonel Mitchell."

In his statement President Coolidge reviews briefly the causes and course of the trial, declaring Mitchell has characterized the administration of the War and Navy departments, as "incompetent, criminally negligent, and almost treasonable," and that the board of review "finds that these statements were made without basis of fact."

Mr. Reid's statement said: "During the pleasure to my notion, is the most un-American sentence ever pronounced. The brand and butter of this gallant colonel who proved his worth on the field of battle, is dependent upon whim, not only of the present executive, but his successor in office and evidently is for the sole purpose of humiliating the colonel and keeping the truth from the people."

"The sentence as revised by the President means that for five years the nation will be without its foremost champion of an adequate national defense."

"I am informed that the record of this court martial went to the President only today; yet this case involving a great national problem was acted upon by the chief executive within a few hours. Why this unseemly haste?"

"This whole proceeding, from start to finish—the preliminary investigation, preferring of the charges, ordering of the trial, the convening of the court, the conduct of the prosecution in court, the verdict, the sentence and the approval of the board of review, the approval of the judge advocate general, the approval of the secretary of war, and now the president's quick action—shows that an invisible hand and hand have labored without ceasing for this day's verdict."

The former air officer is at liberty, however, to give his opinions to congressional committees or civilian bodies.

Major General John A. Hull, judge advocate general, holds that he may do so as an individual if he desires. Plans already have been made to invite him to testify before house committees.

At the Mitchell home callers were informed by servants that neither Mr. nor Mrs. Mitchell was "receiving." In this way the convicted man maintained the silence he has kept since his court martial trial last October.

Intimate friends expected, however, that the silence soon would be shattered. They indicated that he was preparing a statement which he would make public soon.

Reid's charge of "unseemly haste," was answered at the White House today by the statement that President Coolidge had acted only after several days of conferences with Secretary Davis of the War Department. It was said that the papers in the case reached the
