STATE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE MEETING IS OPENED TODAY

President Vining in Opening
Address Says Business
Leaders of State Are
Working Unitedly.

(Associated Press Local Wire.)
PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 28.—That business leaders of the state have united in a practical harmonious working agreement on a state development program and that the carrying out of this program will result in wonderful development of Oregon in the next few years, was the assertion of Irving E. Vining, president of the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce, at the annual meeting of that organization which opened here today.

Delegates from every section of Oregon were present and the day was devoted to discussions of problems of the organization and of plans for co-ordination of the development activities.

Mr. Vining said that land settlement work is one of the most important phases of the work outlined. He warned the delegates that they should not let the prospective settlers fall into the hands of selfish real estate men whose only ambition is to make a sale and as large one as possible, but that committees should be organized to take charge of newcomers and to see to it that they are given opportunity to purchase land within their means and which will be best suited to their line of agriculture.

Marketing, he said, goes with land settlement, for it is most vital that the farmer should have the advantage of orderly marketing to succeed.

The speaker discussed the tourist problem and urged that communities provide adequate tourist camps in addition to the fine tourist hotels which have been provided. These camps, he said, should be provided with small cottages as they are greatly in demand and will not compete with tourist hotels.

He also said that there should be a campaign launched to get the tourists off the great highways and out into the byways into beautiful and secluded mountain and seashore spots. This plan, if followed, he said, would result in keeping tourists longer in the state. He suggested that the slogan, "you have traveled our highways, enjoy our byways," should be printed on every piece of tourist literature distributed by each community.

**BIG LINER HITS
PIER TRYING TO
DOCK IN STORM**

(Associated Press Local Wire.)
NEW YORK, Jan. 28.—A stiff wind today caused the liner Aquitania to crash into her pier while trying to dock. No serious damage resulted. The big liner was two days late because of the storm. "There is no worse weather than we have had on this trip," said Sir James Charles, commander. "We had a whole gale for 72 hours on one stretch, the longest I have ever known."

At times the Aquitania was obliged to reduce her speed to five or six knots. The lowest day's mileage was 52. The only damage was to two port holes of the starboard side.

The French liner France arrived 24 hours overdue because of heavy seas, snow storms and gales.

Three passengers and three seamen suffered minor injuries when the liner went out of her course Saturday to aid the distressed freighter Antiope.

Two port storm doors and one glass outer door crashed with the impact of the storm-driven seas as the ship swung off its course, in-

RUSSIAN THIRST
WILL BE QUENCHED

MOSCOW, Jan. 28.—To satisfy the ever growing thirst of the Russian population, the Soviet government in 1926 will produce 75,000,000 gallons of vodka of 40 per cent strength. The government also will produce 5,000,000 gallons of brandy and liquors of sixty per cent strength.

The total cost of the production of vodka for the coming year is estimated at \$250,000,000, from which the state will derive a revenue of approximately \$175,000,000.
